## Sermon Quotes and Questions

"...believers ask questions because we trust that God is the one who answers. Psalms show us that we don't have to ask our questions from outside the faith or sequester them in a basement corner. Psalmists don't treat questions like expensive china to be used only on rare occasions. They pray their questions at every turn...questions may make us sound like skeptics, but in fact they show the depth of our trust. We question God without shyness. We accost God when his attention seems to be lacking. We complain about God to God." —Kevin Adams, 150: Finding your story in the Psalms, 97.

#### Beneath the Arms

What does it mean to trust God? Is it quiet, calm, reposed? When you think of the ideal person who trusts in God, who do you imagine them to be? Psalm 13 suggests that it can be an act of trust to question God (with impunity!). How might that challenge your image of trust?

How might it expand your understanding of trust?

### You are Here

Psalms give us direction and names for parts of our spiritual life. A big part of our spiritual life (and significant part of the psalms) a re experiences of disorientation: "God, I thought life was like this, but now I don't know which end is up. Where are you?" When was a time you were disoriented in your life? At the time, did that seem like it had anything to do with God? If so, what did you say? If not, what do you wish that you would've said? Can you talk to God about that now?
