All visitors are welcome to receive Holy Communion who have been baptized with water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and who receive Communion in their own church.

Lenten Goat Drive for the Diocese of Kibungo. Goats are an instrument of community and financial growth for our brothers and sisters in the Diocese of Kibungo. Each goat provide milk and manure to each family and cost \$40 each. The diocese utilizes the funds we send to purchase goats (all female) from herdsman and present them to potential recipients who chose their goat. They do not officially own the goat until it has borne two offspring that are given to other members of the village.

Your contribution made through Lent will go toward the purchase of goats this Spring (**Feb 22nd – March 16th**). The cost per goat is \$50, but any contribution will be combined with others to provide these important goats.
