## **Belonging to Christ**

Our primary resource for prayer as Anglicans, in addition to the Scriptures, is a the Book of Common Prayer. The Lord's Prayer is central to the BCP and is included in every service.

Rule of Prayer: A way of ordering our lives around a daily pattern of prayer and reading of Scripture.

We should strive for a prayer life in which we "pray without ceasing."

## The Lord's Prayer

Key is that Jesus taught this prayer to his disciples – Matthew 6:5-8 and Luke 11:1,5-13

## Pray then like this:

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.[a]

10 Your kingdom come, your will be done,[b]
on earth as it is in heaven.

11 Give us this day our daily bread,[c]
12 and forgive us our debts,

as we also have forgiven our debtors.

- <sup>13</sup> And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. [d] Matthew 6:5-8
  - † The Address: Our Father who art in heaven.
  - ♦ First Petition: Hallowed be thy name
  - ♦ Second Petition: Thy kingdom come.
  - † Third Petition: Thy will be done on, on earth as it is in heaven
  - ♦ Fourth Petition: Give us this day our daily bread
  - † Fifth Petition: And forgive us our trespasses
  - ♦ Sixth Petition: And lead us not into temptation
  - ♦ Seventh Petition: But deliver us from evil
  - † Doxology and Amen: Added by the church
