**Matthew 5:6** – Beatitudes – Bless are those who hunger and THIRST for righteousness

**John 6:35** – who ever comes to Me shall not hunger whoever believes in me shall never thirst

## Revelation 21:6

And he said to me, “It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end.  
To the **thirsty** I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment.

### **Revelation 22:17**

The Spirit and the Bride say, “Come.” And let the one who hears say, “Come.” And let the one who is **thirsty** come; let the one who desires take the water of life without price.

### **Isaiah 44:3**

For I will pour water on the **thirsty** land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour my Spirit upon your offspring, and my blessing on your descendants.

### **Psalms 63:1**

O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul **thirsts** for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

### **John 7 – Jesus at the Feast of Booths or Tabernacles**

- *Sukkot* was instituted in Leviticus 23:33–34, “*The LORD said to Moses, ‘Say to the Israelites: ‘On the fifteenth day of the seventh month the LORD’s Feast of Tabernacles begins, and it lasts for seven days.’*”
- Starts four days after Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement)
- Celebrates the Harvest
- Commemorates living in booths/tens for 40 years in the wilderness.
- A joyful festival with emphasis on removing barriers from neighbors (reconcile).
- Six days water jars are poured at foot of the Altar.
- Seventh day, Water Pouring Ceremony.

### **Jesus and the Feast of Booths/ Tabernacles.**

- Jesus goes to the feast secretly.
- Jesus teaches publicly – offends the Jews.
- His hour had not yet come.
- Last day of the feast – living water

### **Ezekiel 47:1-12 Water from the Temple**

- South to the Dead Sea – dead sea becomes fresh.
- North to the Mediterranean.
- Starts small but grows large.
- The impact:
  - Salt to fresh water
  - Abundant life – both fresh water and salt water
  - Trees will have leaves for healing and food. Monthly produce vs. annual

**Psalm 1:1-6**

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; but his delight is in the law<sup>[b]</sup> of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.

He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. The wicked are not so but are like chaff that the wind drives away.

Therefore, the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; for the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.
