

# Messianic Prophecies Fulfilled – Part One

Estimated to be at least forty-four specific Old Testament passage that directly relate to the:

- Birth of Jesus
- The Genealogy of Jesus
- The Public Ministry of Jesus
- His Betrayal
- His Crucifixion
- His Death, Burial and Resurrection

These passages were fulfilled in precise detail and were written hundreds of years prior to their fulfilment and are 100% accurate.

It has been said:

- The New Testament is in the Old Testament “CONCEALED.”
- The Old Testament is in the New Testament “REVEALED.”

Example – Exodus 12 – the Passover; John 13 – Jesus and the Passover, I Cor 5:7 – Christ our Passover

One observation regarding scripture – the author must be outside our time dimension for what was written declared something that was future and yet to come. So, the author of scripture is clearly not “man” but divinely inspired by the Holy Spirit. (2 Tim 3:16).

## **1. Genesis 3:15 – the seed of a woman                      Fulfilled in NT – Galatians 4:4**

Why the seed of a woman? – this foretells the incarnation – Note Romans 5:12; 18-19; Jesus had to a human being so he could fully represent us – He is also called the SECOND ADAM – I Cor 5:22; forty-five; forty-seven

## **2. Genesis 12: 3 - a descendant of Abraham      Fulfilled in NT – Matt 1:1**

Genealogies – Matt 1 Begins with Abraham (Jewish emphasis) and Luke 3 – ends with Adam (Gentile)

## **3. Genesis 17:19 – a descendant of Isaac                      Fulfilled in NT – Luke 3:34**

Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Isaac, and Ishmael - Son of promise (Galatians 4, Romans 9) God’s sovereign election and choice. Flesh vs Spirit. Genesis 22 – the Akedah – sacrifice of Isaac – take you ONLY SON

## **4. Numbers 24:17 – a descendant of Jacob      Fulfilled in NT – Matt 1:2**

Also, Genesis 28:13-15 – promise to bless Jacob as God promised to bless Abraham  
Jacob, Rachael, Leah, Bilhah, Zilpah: twelve tribes – Rachael had one son, Joseph

**5. Genesis 49:10 – from the tribe of Judah**

**Fulfilled in NT – Luke 3:33**

Also see Psalm 60:7; Psalm 108: 8 – Scepters belong to Kings and those in authority, Israel lost their authority to self-govern when Herod denied the right to execute capital punishment by stoning. All capital offenses had to be taken to the Roman authorities. The Pharisees donned sack cloth and ashes because they were convinced the scriptures were broken. The scepter had been taken away and the messiah had not come. But Messiah had come, he was born in Bethlehem.

**6. Isaiah 9:7 – Heir to throne of David**

**Fulfilled in NT – Luke 1:32-33**

The Throne of David

- 1 Samuel 16:1, 16 – God’s choice
- 2 Samuel 7:12-16 – eternal
- Psalm 89:20ff – Throne of David
- Jeremiah 33:14-17 – perpetual throne of David
- Jeremiah 37:27-31 – blood curse -Jehoiakim
- Luke 1:32-33 – Jesus to sit on the Throne of David
- Isaiah 9:6-7 – Government to be upon His shoulders – forever - no end

**7. Psalm 45:6,7; Psalm 102:25-27 – Anointed and eternal; Fulfilled in NT – Heb 1:8-12**

The earth will wear out and changed into a new heaven and new earth, but the kingdom, scepter and throne of Jesus will endure forever.
