Issues of Numerical Growth

The model from the Early Church: Acts 2:37-47

- Peter preached the **WORD** of God call to repentance.
- People **ACKNOWLEDGED** their need what must we do.
- People joined the Church through **BAPTISM**.
- People came under the TEACHING, FELLOWSHIP, BREAKING OF BREAD, AND PRAYER
- Many SIGNS and WONDERS were experienced.
- People gave **GENEROUSLY**.
- People were constant in PRAYER AND WORSHIP.
- God ADDED to the church.



Visible Marks of Growing Churches

- 1. NUMERICAL GROWTH
- 2. TRANSFORMED LIVES
- 3. PROCLAIMED THE WORD OF GOD

Characteristics of Growing Churches

- 1. Growing churches are rooted and grounded in **PRAYER**.
- 2. They have a clear **VISION** and well defined **MISSION**.
- 3. They are committed to **EVANGELISM** as a priority.
- 4. They are NOT ALL THINGS TO ALL PEOPLE.
- 5. They have an ATMOSPHERE that is contagious.
- 6. They invest heavily in YOUTH.
- 7. They pursue **EXCELLENCE** at every level.
- 8. There are no **SACRED COWS**.
- 9. They have a strong **SENIOR PASTOR**.
- 10. As a congregation they are willing to take **RISKS**.



SEVEN CRITERIA FOR CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- 1. **WORSHIP.** According to the Canons of the church, a communicant in good standing is one who is present for worship every Sunday, except for good cause. The worship of God was commanded in the Old Testament through remembering the Sabbath. In the New Testament it is the natural expression of giving thanks to Jesus for what He has done for us. Members worship.
- 2. **BIBLE STUDY.** In *Acts 2:42* we read that the believers continued in the Apostles' teaching. That means they were students. They were learners. They were engaged in the study of Scripture. Members will be in Bible study.
- 3. **PRAYER.** Central to the life of all believers is developing a vibrant and intimate prayer life. Developing a daily quiet time and joining others in corporate prayer is not optional, it is mandatory.
- 4. WITNESS. In Acts 1:8 Jesus tells those gathered to wait in Jerusalem until they receive power from on high, then they will be His witnesses. All believers should be able to bear witness to their faith with conviction and intelligence.
- 5. MINISTRY. In I Corinthians 12, Romans 12, and Ephesians 4 we are told that all believers have been gifted by God, the Holy Spirit, for ministry. There are many different gifts available for each believer, as the Spirit wills, for the common good. All believers have a gift and a ministry.
- 6. **STEWARDSHIP.** Throughout Scripture, giving and honoring God with our wealth is central to the life of the believer. It is clear that all believers are stewards of God's processions and are called to a standard of giving. This is to support the working of the ministry of Jesus Christ on the earth, through the local church.
- 7. **FELLOWSHIP.** In *Acts 2:42* we read that the believers continued in fellowship. This means small group accountability where sin is confessed and others that care deeply review one's faith journey. Believers seek accountability in their faith journey.

These are the normal commitments for all members of the church through Baptism and Confirmation. All those in leadership positions should have met these minimum criteria and should be examples to the flock.

DARE TO SHARE

Overview

Every Christian should have the ability to express their faith in a simple and uncomplicated way when given the opportunity. In fact, the ability to share one's story gives a tremendous credibility to the Christian faith. Your story is not an abstract concept but a faithful telling of how Jesus became real to you and what He has done for you.

When you share your story it's not threatening, it's not preaching, it's not teaching, and it's not talking down to others. You are simply telling others of your experience. It's not up to you to persuade or convince; that's the work of the Holy Spirit. You are "sowing the seed" and allowing your light to shine before others.

Sharing your story and being a faithful witness does require some training, however, you don't need to be "Billy Graham" or a highly educated and trained theologian. In fact, it's probably better that you are not. Average people sharing their story with other average people can (and does) have a huge impact.

Some Basic Tips About Sharing Your Story

- 1. Don't embellish keep it simple and truthful tell it like it is without exaggeration
- 2. If you have never had an "powerful/dynamic" conversion experience say so.
- 3. Avoid Christian Jargon washed by the blood; atonement, justification, sanctification etc.
- 4. Avoid lots of biblical quotes
- 5. Don't argue or try to defend God just tell they your story
- 6. Answer objects as best you can, however, it's ok to say you don't know
- 7. Be sensitive to the Holy Spirit sometimes less is better
- 8. You are not talking about "religion" or your denomination, only your personal experience with the Lord
