- The Lamb and the 144,000 (The Messianic Army/countercultural people)
- The messages of the three angels
 - o The eternal Gospel
 - o Babylon's fall announced (cf. Isaiah 2.19)
 - = World system not under God: social/religious/ cultural/economic; *e.g. Babylon, Rome*—pagan power of the day whose fall awaits the end of history (Rev 15.1; 16.17-19)
 - o A call to perseverance & pronouncement of blessing

 - o The "glory of the Lord" (*cf.* 1 Kings 8.10-11; Exod 40.34-35)
