Answers this major question: How can sinful man be made righteous before a Holy God?

Romans is the foundational epistle that answers that question.

Romans will show that we are declared righteous by faith and there is no condemnation.

Romans 8: 1-2 Therefore there is now no condemnation at all for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life [a] in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.

<u>Matthew 5:6</u> – blessed are those that hunger and thirst after righteousness, they will be satisfied.

Romans 14:17 – kingdom of God is righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit

Matthew 6:33 – seek ye first the kingdom of God and its righteousness

Romans 1:1-15 Organization of the Letter

- 1. Paul Introduces Himself who the letter is from
- 2. Paul Introduces the Gospel what the letter is about
- 3. Paul Introduces the Recipients who the letter is addressed to

Himself – vs 1, 5,9-15

- Bondservant slave
- Called
- Apostle to gentiles
- Bring about obedient to the faith
- Vs 9-15 Paul's desire to visit and preach in Rome

The Romans

- Called
- Beloved of God
- Saints holy ones
- Tender greeting: Grace and Peace from God the Father and Jesus
- Paul's thankfulness for the people
- Thankful for their faith and witness
- Impacting the Roman Empire key cities were Paul's target

The primary tool of conversion was personal testimony, OT Scripture, and attested with signs and wonders.

Paul Introduces the Gospel v 2 - 15

- Promised by God beforehand in the scriptures not about Paul it's all God
- It's all about Jesus
- His divinity Son of God
- His humanity Son of David
- Resurrection of the dead attests to his innocence before the law
- Romans 6
- Roman court 3 trials, Pilate, Herod, Pilate nothing worthy of death, crucified
- Jewish court innocent Annas, Caiaphas, Sanhedrin blasphemy
- God's court innocent He was raised from the dead
- DEATH, BURIAL AND RESURRECTION I Corinthians 15:1-4
- According to the scriptures not according to Paul or the other witnesses mentioned
 - o Mathew 12: 39-40; The Sign of Jonah
 - o Psalm 16:9-10

VS 16-17 – The Power of the Gospel

- Not ashamed of the gospel
- Power of God for salvation (body, soul and spirit)
- You must believe not intellectual ascent, but firm commitment to live into God's truth Our behavior matters John 14:15 "if you love me, you will keep my commandments"
- Jew first, then the gentile
- In the gospel righteousness is revealed how can sinful man be made right with God?

- Righteousness is the central theme of Romans
- It is the gospel of Jesus Christ that tells us how to become acceptable and right with HIM

Vs 18 – 21- God's Wrath

- Jesus endured God's wrath by becoming:
 - o Isaiah 53
 - o Passover lamb in Exodus 12
 - o I Corinthians 5:7
 - o Galatians 3:13
- God placed all His wrath on Jesus instead of us.
- God will never condone your sin He will forgive you and help you be free, but not accept or bless sin God is Holy
- Why do people suppress the Truth? because they prefer unrighteousness
- John 3:19: And this is the judgment, that the Light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the Light; for their deeds were evil.
- There is no excuse When you fail to honor God and give thanks to God two things follow:
 - You become futile in your speculations.
 - o And your heart will be come darkened.
- Two evidences:
 - o external (creation), Psalm 19:1
 - o Psalm 8:3-4
 - o Psalm 148:1-6
 - o Acts 17:24-31
 - o internal (capacity to see and appreciate/conscience)
- In creation God has revealed
 - His eternal power
 - His divine nature

Vs 22-32 – Downward "devolution" of the Human Race

- 1. Suppression of the Truth
- 2. Ignoring God's Revelation
- 3. Perverting God's Glory

Professing to be wise they became fools: 1 Corinthians 1:20-27

Three times God "gives them up" – abandoned

- Vs 22 23 Idolatry always the first step away from God (Psalm 135: 15-18)
- Vs 24 First, "God gave them up" to sexual immorality
- Vs 26-27 Second, "God gave them up" Sexual Perversion homosexuality in women and Men.

Note Leviticus Chapter 18, 19 and 20 on Sexual Immorality Sacrifice of Children, Idolatry

- Vs 28 Third, "God gave them up" Deprayed mind
- Vs 29 31 Paul lists 21 examples of a depraved mind in human sinful and unrighteous Behavior
 - 1. Unrighteousness
 - 2. Wickedness
 - 3. Greed
 - 4. Evil
 - 5. Envy
 - 6. Murder
 - 7. Strife
 - 8. Deceit
 - 9. Malice
 - 10. Gossip
 - 11. Slanderers
 - 12. Haters of God
 - 13. Insolent
 - 14. Arrogant
 - 15. Boastful
 - 16. Inventors of evil
 - 17. Disobedient to parents
 - 18. Without understanding
 - 19. Untrustworthy
 - 20. Unloving
 - 21. Unmerciful

Vs 32 Approval of others knowing it deserves death (They know the behaviors are wrong)

2 Timothy 3:1-5 (Paul list 19 examples of sinful human behavior)

But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come. ² For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, slanderers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, ^[a]haters of good, ⁴ treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ holding to a form of ^[b]godliness although they have denied its power; avoid *such people as* these.

Gods Diagnosis – human race is corrupted and deserving of God's wrath.

God's Treatment – a new creation (2 Cor 5:17 Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *this person is* a new ^[g]creation; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.)
