Why the Incarnation?

Legal Conditions

• Had to be a man (born of woman – fully human)

- Had to be without sin (Heb 4:15)
- Had to be freely given (Philippians 2:1-8)
- Recognized as legal in heaven, earth and under the earth (Col 2:13-15)
- Propitiation: "averting the wrath of God by the offering of a gift." It refers to the turning away of the wrath of God as the just judgment of our sin by God's own provision of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross.
- New Covenant Jesus is at God's right hand as intercessor and mediator of the New Covenant
