- Over the Natural Order......Calming Storm
- Over lack......Multiplication of food
- Over Death.....Lazarus

Early Church – power ministry – Book of Acts overview

- Acts 3:1-10 Lame beggar healed by Peter and John
- Acts 4:30 Intercession for healing, signs and wonders and boldness
- Acts 5:12 16 Signs and wonders, Peter's shadow, healing and deliverance
- Acts 6: 8 Stephen full of grace and power performing signs and wonders

Discovering your God Given Gifts

In the catechism, from the Book of Common Prayer we are asked:

- Q. Who are the ministers of the church?
- R. The ministers of the church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and deacons.
- Q. What is the Ministry of the laity?
- R. The ministry of lay persons is to <u>represent Christ</u> and His church; to <u>Bear witness</u> to him wherever they may be; and, according to the <u>gifts</u> given them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship and governance of the Church.
- Q. What is the duty of all Christians?
- R. The duty of all Christians is to follow Christ; to come together week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray and give for the spread of the kingdom of God.

Key Points About the Body of Christ and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 12 (Entire Chapter Summary)

- 1. We are not to be **IGNORANT** of Spiritual gifts.
- 2. Everybody is gifted by God the Holy Spirit we are not talking about simple human abilities we all have a gift given to us by the Holy Spirit.
- 3. Not everybody has the **SAME** gift but they all come from the same Spirit.
- 4. The gifts are given for the common good, not individual glory
- 5. Some gifts are more visible than others and seemingly more powerful.
- 6. All gifts are of **EQUAL** value to the body of Christ and in the Lord's sight.
- 7. Nobody has **ALL** the gifts we need each other.
- 8. The gifts are given by God for **HIS PURPOSES**.
- 9. We will be held **ACCOUNTABLE** for using our gifts.
- 10. We do not get to pick and choose our gifts God does **POTTER VS. CLAY**.
- 11. The health of the ministry and health of the body is dependent on all offering their gifts to God.
- 12. Clergy did not get all the gifts nor are they capable of doing all of the ministry.

Four Criteria for Discerning Your Spiritual Gifts

- 1. You will like it. (enjoyment and energy will be present)
- 2. Your gifting will compliment who you already are.
- 3. You will bear fruit.
- 4. Your gifts will be affirmed by others.

The model from the Early Church: Acts 2:37-47

- Peter preached the **WORD** of God call to repentance.
- People **ACKNOWLEDGED** their need what must we do?
- Repent, Believe, Be Baptized, and Receive the Holy Spirit
- People joined the Church through **BAPTISM**.
- People came under the TEACHING, FELLOWSHIP, BREAKING OF BREAD AND PRAYER
- Many **SIGNS** and **WONDERS** were experienced.
- People gave **GENEROUSLY**.
- People were constant in **PRAYER AND WORSHIP**.
- God **ADDED** to the church.

Seven Criteria for Church Membership

- 1. **WORSHIP.** According to the Canons of the church, a communicant in good standing is one who is present for worship EVERY Sunday, except for "good cause." The worship of God was commanded in the Old Testament through "remembering the Sabbath." In the New Testament it is the natural expression of giving thanks to Jesus for what He has done for us. Members worship.
- 2. **BIBLE STUDY.** In *Acts 2:42* we read that the believers continued in the Apostles' teaching. That means they were students. They were learners. They were engaged in the study of scripture. Members will be in Bible study.
- 3. **PRAYER.** Central to the life of all believers is developing a vibrant and intimate prayer life. Developing a daily quiet time and joining others in corporate prayer is not optional, it is mandatory.
- 4. **SHARE CHRIST.** In **Acts 1:8** Jesus tells those gathered to wait in Jerusalem until they receive power from on high, then they will be His witnesses. All believers should be able to "bear witness" to their faith with conviction and intelligence.
- 5. MINISTRY. In *I Corinthians 12, Romans 12, and Ephesians 4,* we are told that all believers have been gifted by God the Holy Spirit for ministry. There are many different gifts given to each believer as the Spirit wills for the common good. All believers have a gift and a ministry.
- 6. **GIVING.** Throughout scripture, giving and honoring God with our wealth is central to the life of the believer. It is clear that all believers are stewards of God's processions and are called to a standard of giving. This is to support the working of the ministry of Jesus Christ on the earth, through the local church.
- 7. **FELLOWSHIP.** *Acts* 2:42 we read that the believers continued in fellowship. This means small group accountability where sin is confessed and others that care deeply review one's faith journey. Believers seek accountability in their faith journey.
