Luke 1:35 says, "And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God." This is one of the most significant and theologically rich Christmas verses. Let me explain

First, it shows that salvation comes only from the Lord. Since the time that God gave the promise to bring a savior in Genesis 3:15, God's people have longed for the time when the promise would be fulfilled. When Jesus was conceived in Mary God not only kept that promise, it showed that God alone was able to keep that promise. A supernatural Savior required a supernatural means of arrival. If Jesus had been born in the ordinary fashion, there could be a legitimate question about why he could claim to be unique. But the virgin birth shows from his beginning the power of God in action.

Second, it unites the full humanity and deity of Jesus in one person. There are infinite ways God could have redeemed his world. But he chose to do so through his Son, perfectly equipped to do that work as both human and divine. Imagine if God had decided to simply have Jesus show up as a mature human being with no record of his past. It would be very difficult for us to understand how he is a human, like us in every way (except for sin). And if God had brought Jesus into this world as all other humans are—with both a biological father and mother—it would have been difficult for us to understand how Jesus is fully God.

The virgin birth of Jesus makes clear to us he is both fully human, having the position to save us, and fully God, having the power to save us.

Third, it makes Jesus' humanity possible without inherited sin. Every person who is born into this world comes with the sin of Adam. We belong to a human race that rebelled against God himself. And when we are born, we have both the moral guilt of that rebellion as well as that rebellion's moral corruption—which means we are both born indicted as sinners and we tend toward committing sin.

If Jesus had been born in the ordinary way the line of descendent from Adam would not have been interrupted—Jesus would be a sinner as we are. But Jesus' miraculous birth means he is both like us and not like us. This seems to be the point made in Luke 1:35 where the angel tells Mary that Jesus' unusual conception by the power of the Holy Spirit would mean that Jesus himself would be born "holy."

Luke 1:35 should not be taken to mean, however, that our sinful character is passed only from father (and not mother) to children. The Bible nowhere indicates that is the case. It is better for us to say that in this case not only did sinful nature not pass to Jesus from a sinful father, but the Holy Spirit also prevented that sinful nature from passing to Jesus from his mother.

Rejoice, my friend, in the virgin birth of your Savior. God has perfectly provided a Savior exactly suited to save you!





Redeemer Women's Ministry

We all desire to have godly contentment regardless of circumstances, good or bad; to say with David, "My heart is steadfast, O God!" (Psalm 108:1) But how do we do that? How do we remain consistent in our faithfulness to God, with our hearts resting in His Sovereignty and Goodness and trusting in His plans for our lives? In His Word, God has provided many helpful role models to teach us and show us what a contented life looks



like. We will consider Joseph from the Old Testament and Paul from the New Testament to glean just a few lessons.

In the Old Testament Joseph demonstrated his faithfulness in multiple situations, both positive and negative. First, though he and his brothers did not get along, he followed his father's directive to bring food to his brothers while they were tending their flocks at Shechem. Later, after he was sold as a slave, he diligently and wisely served his master, Potipher, and was promoted. When he was accused unjustly and sent to prison, Joseph continued to serve, and God gave him favor with the jailor. Whether running Potipher's house or staying in the prison, Joseph maintained a heart focused on God. Then, when called upon to interpret Potipher's dream he pointed Potipher toward God by saying that God alone interprets dreams. What lessons can we learn from Joseph? He continued to demonstrate faithful obedience in a variety of circumstances. He rested in God, not men or situations, and acknowledged that favor came from God, not himself. Finally, Jospeh demonstrated that he was able trust God's plan when he declared that God had sent him to Egypt in order to save lives (Genesis 50:20); and he praised God for the work that He had done.

In the New Testament we see the example of Paul. He, too, was faithful and obedient in a variety of circumstances: prison, preaching, standing before kings and councils, shipwrecks, and beatings. His goal and message of proclaiming the gospel remained the same (Ephesians 6:19-20). We also see that, consistently, Paul's focus was on Christ not himself (I Corinthians 1:31). He demonstrated a heart that was confident but humble. He prayed and gave praise to God, and he was thankful to God and to others for his care (Romans 16). These characteristics are instructive for us as we consider the attitude of our heart in a variety of situations.

Our main verse as we focus on contentment this year is Philippians 4:11-13, "Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me." It's so helpful to be reminded that contentment can be learned and comes through the power of Christ who strengthens us. We don't have to tough it out; but instead, look to Christ, lean on and obey Him, and operate in the power that He provides. May He help us all grow in the grace of contentment this year!

Redeemer Mission Focus

Word & Deed Ministries: An Introduction

"And whatever you do, in word and deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." Colossians 3:17

As Redeemer and Word & Deed start a relationship it is good for you all to get to know us better. We are a Reformed Christian relief and development ministry that works with indigenous (local) churches, and Christian partners to address the needs of the body and soul of those we work with in the developing world. We do this according to Biblical principles, for the glory of the Lord, in response to the command to love our neighbor (Matthew 22:36-40).

We have established over 25 partnerships in 18 countries around the world to provide educational and diaconal ministry in the communities where our partners are located. Our partners go through a vetting process to ensure a good fit and understanding of the principles of how we work. If there is a good fit we proceed with signed agreements, semi-annual project and financial reporting, correspondence, Zoom calls, and regular visits.

The majority of our partners are located in some of the poorest places in the world. We communicate the predicament of the suffering in the developing world to the people of North America so that they are given the opportunity to respond to their needs in love, motivated by thankfulness for God's grace. We bring Christians together so we can reach out in the name of Christ to serve the poor, nurture covenant families, encourage Biblically faithful churches, and develop local leaders while empowering people to provide for themselves. Teaching the needy that providing for oneself as best as possible is good in recognizing their dignity as God's image-bearers, having been made to work and worship and for them to love their neighbors in their unique circumstances. We are working with our partners towards local sustainability with the understanding it is Christ who blesses the work.

We have a variety of ongoing developmental projects with which we work that include Christian day schools, afterschool programs, vocational and agricultural training, orphan care, medical clinics, and theological & church leadership training. Through all of our children's projects, we are influencing the lives of over 15,000 children for Christ. The projects that they attend are the only places where many of these children hear the gospel. All of these projects are being overseen and run locally by indigenous Christians. This is very important because they are the ones who are working in their communities and know the language and the cultural idiosyncrasies of the people. That being said, the most important goal of Word & Deed projects has always been that the gospel is proclaimed in every project.

Another way we work with our partners is through one-time infrastructure projects, including well drilling, building projects, supplying medical equipment, and more. In the last few years, we have helped build over a dozen culturally appropriate Christian schools. In some cases, the local communities volunteer to help with the construction of these buildings. Many of these schools are self-sufficient in their daily operations but require help with construction costs.

Other one-time projects include the provision of good, reformed books to pastors and seminaries, the translation of reformed materials into local languages, the distribution of Bibles, and sponsoring pastor-training conferences. We have found in many places that the average pastor has little to no formal training and they need resources and training to be more Biblically astute in their understanding and proclamation of the scriptures. These tools can be invaluable to the pastors who receive them.


Another important aspect of our ministry is disaster relief (natural & man-made). We generally only get involved in disaster relief in countries where our partners are located or have trusted contacts. In the last four years, we have been involved in relief/food efforts that have reached over 35,000 families. So far this year we have helped with relief for Armenian refugees (ethnic purging), Haiti (food), Kenya (flooding), South Sudan (food), Malawi (food), Myanmar (political unrest), and Venezuela (emergency relief).

Relief efforts for Christians being persecuted by Hindus in Northeast India have been going on for about a year and a half. The local and federal governments have done nothing to stop it. Burning churches (over 300), and homes (over 7000), killing, and displacing thousands of people. We work with the Reformed & Presbyterian Church of Northeast India which is bringing relief to those affected.


Word & Deed has three areas of emphasis. First, a **Gospel focus** in all projects; second, working with **indigenous leadership**; and third, working with our partners toward **local sustainability** under Christ. We strive to be transparent with our supporters, keeping you updated on the ongoing work of our partners and handling the resources that the Lord has provided us with in a stewardly way. Word & Deed is <u>accredited</u> by the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA).





Just Do Something- By: Kevin DeYoung...Book Report: Kezia Beeke

What God wills for us in our lives is a question that any Christian at any may have about their lives. Should I make friends with them? Should I go to college? What should I major in? Should I get married? Should we have kids? How should I invest my money wisely? When should I retire? Do I have enough money for retirement? All important questions that we are pondering. How do we discern what God wants for us in our lives?

Kevin DeYoung shares in 'Just Do Something' that God's perfect decree cannot be moved. All of His laws will come to pass, and what He has ordained is right (Eph.1:11). God also has a will of desire. If He wills to tell us His plan, then He will. This is the way He wants us to live (Deut. 29:29). He wants us to do what is pleasing in His sight. There are 5 reasons DeYoung lists that we



are so eager to find out what happens. 1. We Want To Please God 2. Some Of Us Are Timid 3. We Want Perfect Fulfillment 4. We Have Too Many Choices 5. We Are Cowards. However, God is not a "Magic 8-Ball" as Kevin put it. We don't wait until the answer rolls around the ball and appears to us. That is not how God works, and in some cases- it is dishonoring to Christ. This is wrong, God has everything planned out for us, and He tells us over 70 times in the Bible to "Not Be Afraid!".

So, we have learned why we want to know the future, and why it's bad. But what can we do instead? We can live as Christ tells us to. Seek His Kingdom- always be looking for the Kingdom of Christ, because God knows exactly what we need to live. God will lead us, show us, and demonstrate again and again that we just need to trust Him. We do not need to be afraid for the future, or always want to know the future- we just need to live in the moment and trust God!

Three ways we can ground ourselves in Christ and find out what God wants for our lives: 1. Prayer!– Talk to God! Tell Him how you feel and express your feelings through words. He is the one who holds all these answers, and through His perfect timing, you will come to trust Him more and more. But that doesn't start unless you talk with Him. 2. Scripture!– This is God's word written just for you, and it has been preserved through the years so you could have a copy today. 3. Counsel– there are other people in the body of Christ who have also struggled with these thoughts, and they are here to talk! Many times, talking with other believers is a way to grow in your own faith, and be encouraged by fellow companions.

Not all these questions will be answered right away, but over time- the God of All Wisdom and Peace will provide these questions with His perfect responses. I would highly recommend reading this book, as it provides so much insight and information as to ways to get back into the Scriptures and how to give yourself all to Christ, trusting only in Him.
