

Hello Redeemer! My name is Brad Way.



Before moving to Pennsylvania where I grew up most of my life, I lived in North Carolina. Being from the "Bible Belt", I had considered myself a Christian because that is what my family, along with everyone else in the community, seemingly was. My family moved to a small town outside of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 2005, when I was only 9 years old. As I grew up, especially through middle school, I was more than willing to identify myself as a Christian, however, my life was showing itself to be less and less aligned with how Christ calls His people to live--a life of dead faith, as the Apostle James would put it. It wasn't until I heard my youth pastor in my church read from Revelation during Sunday School one morning that the Lord brought me to a saving faith in Jesus Christ. It was not the words of Christ's love that God used, but the words of judgment, specifically these words from Revelation 3:15-16: "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth."

I had never known God to have anger, and when the Holy Spirit awoke in my heart, I realized that I was a fitting example of the lukewarm Jesus spoke of in Revelation 3. That day, the Lord saved me, as He showed me my guiltiness before Him and the free gift of grace I had in Christ by His death and resurrection.

Since then, God has been faithful--sanctifying me, disciplining me, and blessing me. The Lord provided opportunities to share the Word of God with others through all sorts of avenues, whether in more formal positions as a Bible Study leader or through organic conversations with friends. The encouragement and joy these brought me led me to pursue youth ministry at Fourth Presbyterian Church in Bethesda, Maryland after graduating from Penn State University, where I was a Middle School Director until April of 2022.




Thursday Morning Men's Bible Study


I recently received some very encouraging praises from Stephen. I thought it would gladden your hearts to hear them as well!



If checking off the boxes on the cards promotes guilt or a feeling of performance, don't use it. Our goal is that you be encouraged to pray, not be burdened. However you use this, or how often, may it bring glory to God.




<u>To Change All Worlds: Critical Theory from Marx to Marcuse, by Carl R.</u> <u>Trueman</u>






<u>Making Good Return: Biblical Wisdom on Honoring Aging Parents,</u> <u>by Kathleen B. Nielsen</u>
