Staff hiring update

As your Session seeks to fill open ministry positions over the coming months, we are committed to providing monthly updates to keep our congregation informed on our progress. At a minimum, we plan to do this on the first Sunday of every month during morning worship services and in our "Redeemer Life" newsletter. As is the nature of any hiring process, the information we have to share month to month might vary but regardless we will share as much as we are able on the process and how things are progressing. There are currently (3) open positions that the session is working to fill in the coming months: a youth ministry leader, an associate pastor and a worship music director.

Youth Ministry Leader

This role is intended to be a full-time position that, among other responsibilities, will focus primarily on teaching and discipling middle school, high school, and college-age students through formal studies, events and activities. We are open to filling this role with either an ordained or non-ordained person. The job posting for our youth ministry leader position went live early June and is posted on both Redeemer's website as well as numerous other posting locations around the country. As interested candidates reach out, the search committee acts as the first point of contact and provides an initial screening interview. Promising candidates will ultimately be handed off from this committee to the session for more formal interviews and/or approval. While there has been some interest already, no candidates have advanced past initial screening as of yet. If any of you know of a name we should consider for this role, please speak to any of the search committee members (Tyler VanRee, Marty & Keri Huizenga or Laurel Delange). Thank you for your continued prayers for this open position.

Worship Music Director

Session is also giving attention to our worship music leadership. Music and singing are an important aspect of our worship, and we want to continue to see this part of worship grow and flourish. We have convened a Music Ministry Planning Team to evaluate our current resources and needs and how best to address medium- and longer-term music ministry. The first meeting produced a helpful analysis, and we plan to meet multiple times in July to define the staffing roles that will inform our search process. Our interim leadership is provided by the pianists. Rebecca Braam coordinates our vocalists and David Entingh is leading AV. Be sure to thank them. We will keep you posted on the progress.

Associate Pastor

Finally, is the open Associate Pastor position. Session has begun discussions on this role will formalize the job description and authorize a search committee in the next few weeks. More details will be forthcoming as this process gets underway.

As members, you can help during this time. God has already chosen those who will fill these roles and serve our church in this way, so please pray that God moves these next staff members hearts towards Redeemer and pray that God would lead us to those He has already chosen for us. Session also welcomes any names or recommendations any of you might have for these open roles.


Dave Byker

Matthew 25:35-40






This Changes Everything by Jaquelle Crowe, reviewed by Keziah Beeke

When Jaquelle Crowe was 18 years old, she decided she wanted to write a book dedicated to all young adults and teenagers to explain identity, spiritual growth, relationships, sin etc. All important in the life of a youth and helpful in the journey of a young Christ-follower. She makes a special note on how kids can be influential in the life of the church. She strongly believes and suggests that the adolescents in the church are also useful in bringing aid to the body of Christ, no matter our age or other differences that stop us from wanting to share our faith.

Crowe makes sure that her point gets across and openly tells her fellow brothers and sisters in Christ that their Christian lives don't matter at all unless they truly know God. Not just know about Him, even the demons know about Him, but to truly know God. Jaquelle also states that this should be our new worldview. To see everyone through the eyes of Christ and to live a new life while learning how to love others well and growing in our faith and walk with the Lord.



I would recommend this book to anyone within the age of 10–19 because it truly answers some of the hardest questions a teen or preteen might be struggling with, and it helps explain the importance of what it means to follow Christ wholeheartedly.
