This summer the women of Redeemer met every Tuesday for 6 weeks in order to grow in wisdom and Biblical understanding of several relevant topics in our post-Christian culture. It was an encouraging time of lively discussions and Biblical applications. In our first session, we talked about what it looks like to engage with those around us, especially those with differing worldviews. Often with this topic, LGBTQ+ worldviews come up as a barrier for engagement with others, so we navigated Biblical ways to speak the truth in love. Our second study delved into the heated topic of news and social media and how to intentionally stay informed without succumbing to the anxiety it can provoke. Third, the conversation centered on creation care—our distinct perspective

Christians that frames our care for the earth. For our fourth meeting, we took a deep dive into Scripture to discover the meaning of Sabbath/the Lord's Day. In addition. we considered Biblical womanhood and how that differs from our culture's ideas of feminism. And last, we concluded our studies with evangelism, a perfect way to wrap up the series. The goal for these sessions was to provide a space for rich, fruitful conversations that serve to cultivate our faith and guide us as we encounter friends. neighbors, and co-workers in a world that is increasingly hostile to Christians. Thank you to all the women who participated as facilitators as well as attendees. We, as the Women's Ministry Team, enjoyed our time with you!

Redeemer Open House








High School Youth Group – Summer 2025 Schedule



In June, we were blessed with a beautiful morning to serve our community through the Redeemer Food Pantry Outreach! We were able to provide each of the 20 families with an array of staple food items, toilet paper, ground beef or chicken, milk, bread, eggs, potatoes, carrots, and onions. Most importantly we were able to extend the love of Christ and welcome them into our church with fellowship and prayer. We had a couple of new families attend and were eager to welcome them. Building relationships is a large part of the ministry of food pantry as we want to draw attendees into a relationship with Jesus, the only one who can truly meet their needs!

Baked Beans, Black Beans, Chili Beans, Garbanzo Beans, really any kind of beans! Please make sure perishable items are marked "food pantry" and placed in the fridge or freezer in the church kitchen. You can always check in with the Hill's as the 12th gets closer to find out what items are missing or most needed. This is a great opportunity to get your family involved in serving! Thank you for enabling Redeemer to continue helping an even greater number of families with critical needs and giving to them in Jesus name. Please consider dropping donations off at the Church THIS week or coordinating with the Hill's for pick-up or drop off of perishable items. Helpers are also needed to serve from 9:00-11:30 Saturday July 12th to set up, serve, and clean up. You will surely be blessed by serving through this outreach in Jesus name.

God Is God & You Are You by Thomas Davis

Does Jesus' command to be his witnesses (Acts 1:8) seem like an impossible task for you to do? Do you fear offending people with your attempts to do so? Maybe you think you don't have the gifts for evangelism, so it would be better if someone else did it.


Every Christian is being a witness from the moment of conversion on through their actions and conversations. At times it is more evident than others but just living out the Christian faith testifies to God's work in you. And God has made you the way you are, placed you where you are, and put the people that are in the places you go for a reason.

Davis gives so much encouragement on ways to think about God, the Gospel, grace, eternity, yourself, people, and the church family that will help you see being a witness for Jesus as an exciting, very possible privilege for every Christian. He even includes a way to look at the problem of evil as an argument for the need and the brilliance of the Gospel. He reminds us not to see people not as projects or hopeless cases, but as precious creations of God whom he may call to be a part of his family just like you are.

This might be a good book to read as you prepare for VBS, where many children and their parents may be hearing the good news for the first time, to give a perspective on how God might be using you in the way

he made you to bring people into his family.
