## Why Youth Ministry?

What if I told you that youth ministry is a new idea? It was not until the mid-1800s when we saw programs like Sunday School for adolescents, as well as the creation of organizations like Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA).

As a church that is committed to the historic faith, why would we commit to an idea that appears to be so new?

Simply, because our Lord was, and still is.

No, we never see Jesus adopting all the aspects of what we typically think of when we hear the term "youth ministry". He is never seen taking a group of teens on a short-term mission trip, and he surely never did some of the outrageously inappropriate games that have stained the



legitimacy of youth ministry (look up "Chubby Bunny" on Wikipedia and you will understand what I mean).

However, we do find Christ saying, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Luke 18:16). Additionally, in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus warns anyone who would neglect the spiritual care of a child –

"Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin,



it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea" (Matthew 18:5-6, emphasis mine).

There are still those who would argue that youth ministry is not worth a church's time or (especially) money – they see youth ministry as a surface-level gathering, led by someone at the same level of spiritual maturity as the children present.

That is why youth ministry must be a church-wide, intergenerational effort. Despite its name, youth ministry is not "a young man's game" – it is a calling for all of us who profess Jesus Christ as Lord. As Paul says in 1 Corinthians 11:1, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." If Christ served children of all ages during His earthly ministry, how will you serve the youth here at Redeemer?

# Redeemer Library

Book Review by Denise Amtsbuechler

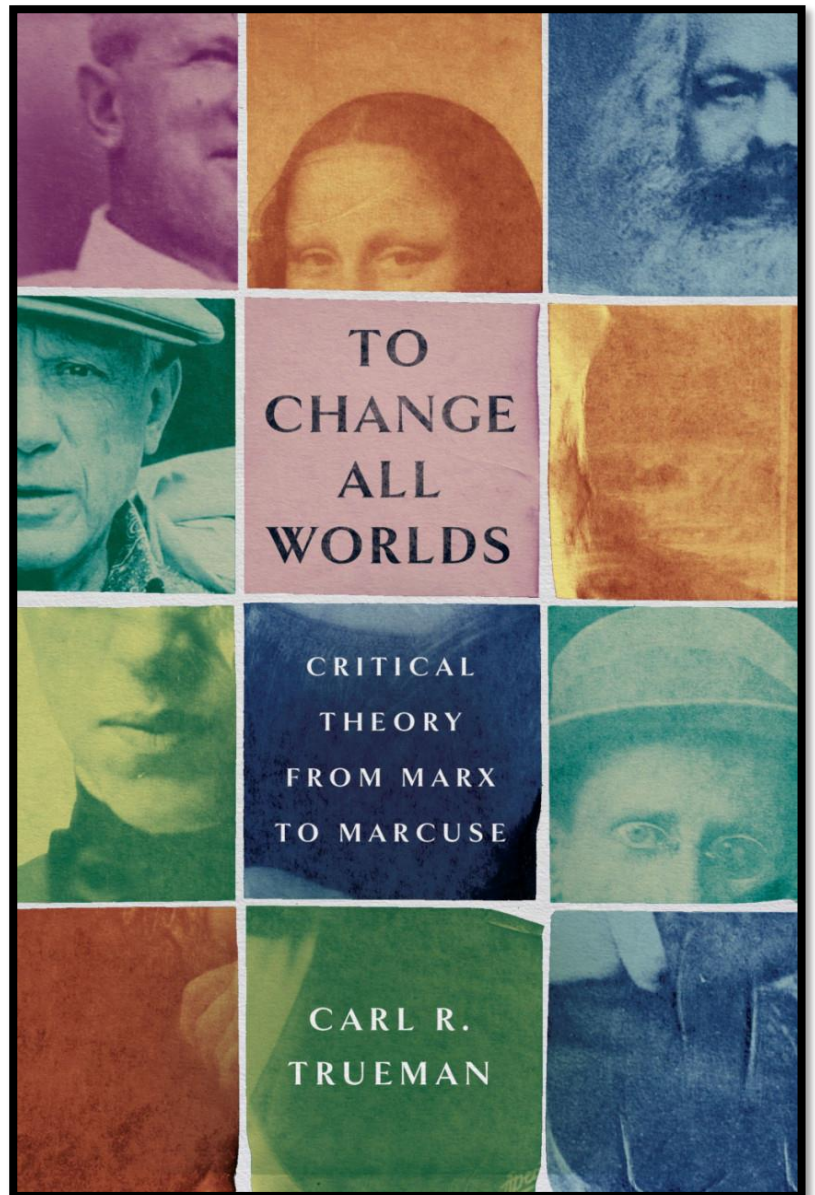
Full disclosure: I have only had time to briefly scan *To Change All Worlds* by Carl R. Trueman. However, I will attempt to give a review of my initial impressions of the book.

Many people are familiar with Trueman's works. He is known as a rigorous Christian thinker, philosopher, historian and theologian. All of these things combine to make him uniquely qualified to analyze, explain and respond to the ideas of Critical Theory, which is currently one of the most influential, and formative worldviews shaping every area of society today.

In *To Change All Worlds*, Trueman presents the history of the people and writings that have led to the multifaceted, and sometimes confusing, philosophy which has come to be known as Critical Theory. He explains the origin and evolution of Critical Theory's foundational concepts and points out some of the resultant fruit it has borne in the contemporary world.

Along the way, Trueman interacts with these ideas and societal trends, showing what he believes is false or incompatible with a Biblical worldview, and what may contain a grain of truth or be useful for Christians engaged with the culture.

I look forward to a deeper reading of the book and hope to absorb more of its quite dense contents.
