The Elder's Corner

Welcome to the Elder's Corner. This month we will be discussing the topic of Life Groups. Let's get started by asking some direct questions.

1. What exactly is a Life Group?

Redeemer OPC's Life Groups exist to magnify our God and mature believers in Christlikeness through meeting on a regular basis, fellowshipping with one another, studying the Word, living life together, praying for each other and serving and caring for one another. Life Groups are the friends you grow, laugh, and serve with. Life Groups gather at church, in people's homes, coffee shops and other places where people love to hang out together.

2. Why Should I be in a Life Group?

First, we weren't created to go through life alone. In Scripture we find consistent encouragement to gather with other followers of Jesus:

- Jesus promises us in Matthew for "where two or three gather in my name, there I am with them".
- Paul tells us in 1 Thessalonians "to encourage one another and build one another up" and in Galatians "to bear one another's burdens".
- Proverbs, instructs us to get advice from others and walk through life with wise people so we can sharpen each other.

Second, your Life Group will be there to support you through difficult seasons and celebrate your most joyful occasions. Joining and being involved in a Life Group positions these friends in your life so that they are there when life happens.

Finally, you have a calling to speak truth and encouragement into others. God will use your Life Group to impact you, but He will also use you to impact your Life Group.

3. What do you actually do in a life Group?

Every Life Group is unique, so each one will look a little bit different. Some discuss Sunday's sermon message or go through Bible studies, others listen to podcasts together, some serve together in the community (Food Pantry) and some discuss weighty theological books. With this church, it appears that a meal is usually part of the fellowship-not a requirement-but there certainly are a lot of good chefs at Redeemer.

Two things you will find in every Life Group are relationships and conversations that help you grow spiritually and personally.

4. How often do they meet?

Most Life Groups meet once a month while some meet twice a month, but it is entirely up to the group on how often you would like to meet.

5. What do I do with my kids while I'm at Life Group?

Different groups navigate this in different ways. Others have the kids watch a movie or <u>Bible App for Kids</u> <u>video</u> while the adults meet. Some include the kids in everything they do as a group. If you need to join a group that has space for children, make sure you check the box on the Life Group Interest Form that references kids.

6. Do I need to sign up for a Life Group for a designated time period?

There is no sign up for a specific time period. Once you have been part of a Life Group, we would encourage you to consider taking a pause after a year and consider joining a new group. This would allow you to meet new friends and develop new relationships. We understand that this would not work for everyone, but it would create a healthier Life Group model.

7. What demographics make up the Life Group's?

Many Life Groups are diverse in age groups and life stages and many groups have similar aged individuals in them. There's no "one size that fits all". Just like the diversity of life.

8. Is it okay to "shop around" for a Life Group?

Absolutely! It's understandable to want to find people you feel comfortable opening up to and developing friendships with. That being said, if you've joined a Life Group and aren't sure if it's the right fit for you, don't give up. **Keep in mind that there's no such thing as a perfect Life Group, because there are no perfect people.** Remember to have grace and patience during the process. If it's clear that this group isn't the best fit for you, though, give another group a try.

9. Is it awkward to show up at a stranger's house and talk about my life?

It can be a little awkward to meet any new group of people. Here's what we promise, though: if you will make a conscious decision to embrace the initial awkwardness and keep showing up, something amazing will happen. Over time, your Life Group will start to feel less like a group of strangers and more like people you've known your whole life. Yes, it's a place where you can find friends. Push through those little moments of weirdness as you get to know each other.

10. What do I do if I would like to become a leader of a Life Group?

If you are currently part of a Life Group start off by talking with your Life Group leader about co-leading your current Life Group. We would encourage you to start off by co-leading a group but if you have previous leadership skills and are ready to start leading your own group, please fill out the Life Group Interest Form and check that you would like to lead a Life Group. All Life Group leaders need to be approved by session.

11. <u>I'm a leader but I want to become a better leader-do you have training materials that can assist me in this goal?</u>

We are very encouraged that you want to improve your leadership skills and we are working on a training program, along with a few other initiatives. Until we have that in place, we would encourage you to discuss with other experienced Life Group leaders what they do for effective leadership in their life groups.

12. <u>What is the first step in joining a Life Group or considering moving to a new Life Group?</u>

The first step in joining or considering moving to a new Life Group is filling out our Life Group Interest Form.

Redeemer Church is growing, and we thank the Lord for that! With growth come challenges; and one of the challenges is the need to develop a long-term plan for Life Groups that can evolve and address growth. We have several people that are looking to join a Life Group and anticipate that the need will continue to grow.

- 1. Be open to adding additional people to your Life Group and/or
- 2. Consider creating a new group out of your existing group.

We understand that the second option could be very difficult with the number of friendships that have been established over the last year or two. Another way to think of this is to recognize the new friendships that you will be gaining.

An **additional initiative** that we would like you to consider is **identifying a co-leader(s) within your Life Group.** This would create a path to develop future Life Group leaders. There are currently a few groups in place that do have co-leaders.

As we experience continued growth, we need to update our model, add new groups, and expand existing groups to accommodate the additional interest.

In summary, if you are part of a Life Group, <u>thank you</u> for contributing to the community of Redeemer Church and if not, <u>please consider it</u>-we would love to get to know you better.


Thursday Morning Men's Bible Study



Our Mission:

Westminster Seminary California (WSC) exists to glorify Christ, teach His Gospel, and serve His Church through graduate theological study. 


Proverbs 9:9-10 Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.¹⁰ The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.

Training Hearts, Teaching Minds and Comforting Hearts, Teaching Minds by Starr Meade, reviewed by Denise Amtsbuechler

One of the most important and sobering callings God gives to parents is to pass on the faith to their children. Churches recognize this and come alongside parents in many ways to support and assist them in fulfilling this calling. From the promises made by the congregation at a child's baptism, to the offering of Sunday school classes, VBS programs, and youth group activities, churches rightly take the task of training children in the faith very seriously. And throughout church history one of the tools for instructing children in the faith has been the use of catechisms. A catechism is an instruction guide of the foundational doctrines of the faith using a question-and-answer format.

Recently the use of catechisms has diminished somewhat. Some people may be unfamiliar with them; others may feel intimidated or unsure of how to use a catechism with their child.





Starr Meade offers help to parents who would like to use catechisms in

their discipleship efforts with their children by writing two family devotion books. The first is Training Hearts, Teaching Minds. It is based on the Westminster Shorter Catechism. And the second, Comforting Hearts, Teaching Minds is based on the Heidelberg Catechism.

Both of these books take a portion of the catechism each week and, over the course of six days (Monday through Saturday), examines and explains what is being taught in that section. This is accomplished via short daily readings and a daily scripture passage.

For families that would like to make use of this time-tested method of passing on a solid foundational understanding of the Christian faith, I would highly recommend checking out these books.
