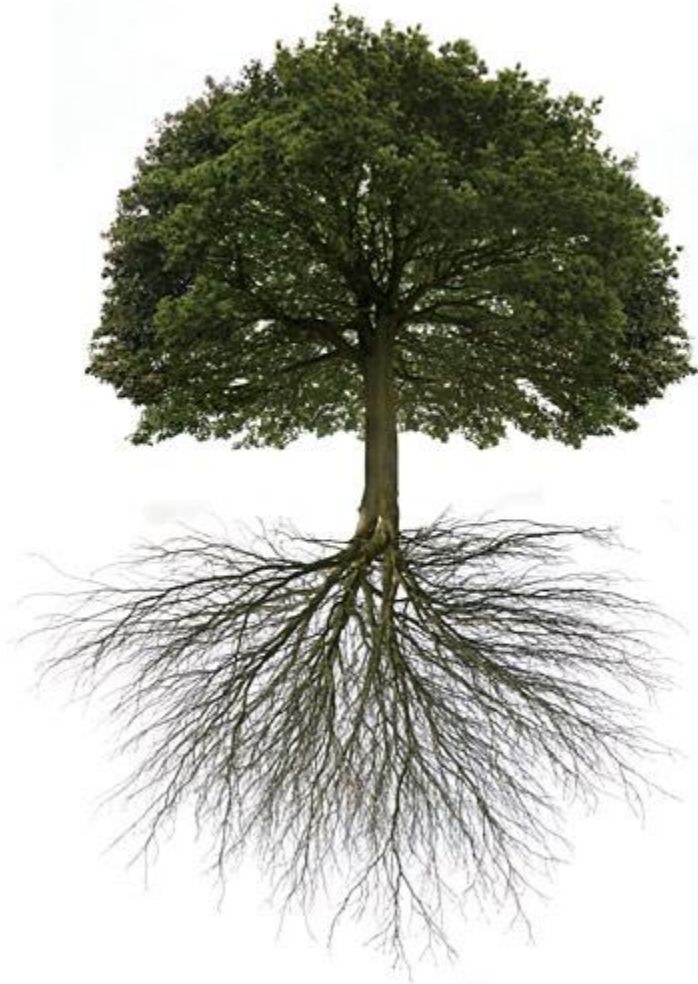

INTRODUCTION

The tempter, Satan, prevailed upon the woman. She chose fellowship with a fork-tongued liar over the all-benevolent God who gave her everything she needed. The man followed her into the rebellion and so the entire human race fell into sin. Death, not life, would now haunt generation after generation. Jealousy, strife, and bitterness would rage in the relationships. The original family was undone and without return to their creator, men and women preferred suppressing the truth about God and taking matters into their own broken hands. Such is the world into which we are all born.

The fallen world, bent on exchanging the truth of God's glory for lies, has a deadly vision for you and your family as does the Prince of this world, Satan. A cosmic battle rages against you and the hearts and minds of all who were created to reflect God's image in Christ. Even worse, we were all born with a heart that joins these rebel forces against God's perfect design for life. Even the vision we think is wise for the family before we were Christians is actually foolish and leads to never-ending destruction under God's omnipotent wrath.

Our only hope to gain true life for ourselves, our spouse, and our children comes with treasuring the person and work of Jesus Christ revealed in the gospel. Undeserving as we are, God loved us in sending his Son into the world for our rescue, redemption, and restoration. The ensuing bibliography is a tool meant to direct parents to biblical and theologically sound literature written to promote the treasuring of Jesus Christ supremely and comprehensively among all. In particular, this bibliography attempts to link people to select resources that help parents and children treasure Jesus Christ as a family. While many people have published articles and books which attempt to grow healthy families, much of this literature stems from empty psychology and humanistic principles devoid of the authority of God's revelation in Scripture and the life-giving truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Thus, rather than having to sort through all the family, parenting, and children's literature made available at a local bookstore, this bibliography should guide parents and their children to trustworthy resources more quickly.

The bibliography is arranged first for parents, as they hold the primary responsibility for the spiritual nurture of their children, and then secondly for children by their age groups up to age 10. The resources are arranged alphabetically within each subsection, the children's resources also including subsections for Bibles, books, scripture memory, and music. An asterisk (*) signifies the most highly recommended resource(s) within that subsection. A brief summary also appears beneath a few of the resources to help you in your selection. As always when reading literature that claims to be based on the Bible, keep your Bible close by your side, ask the Holy Spirit to guard you from error, seek wise counselors where you may have questions, give thanks to God for using godly men and women to help guide us into true discipleship, and enjoy putting on Christ more fully as a family.
