# THE CLASS GOES THROUGH THE END OF FEBRUARY


Thank you for all of the comments and encouraging words. We have five (5) weeks remaining after today, as the class goes through the end of February.

## WEEK SEVEN OUTLINE: "INTRODUCTION"





One of the best general outlines for Christianity & Liberalism can be found for download from the Ligonier Ministries website at a cost of \$1.00. It can be found at <u>www.store.ligonier.org/christianity-and-</u> <u>liberalism-digital-study-guide</u>. (I'll post a link on the website too)

Although I am not following the outline exactly, it is a useful tool and highly recommended as you go through the 100-year-old text. Although easy to understand, Machen does have a very good vocabulary and uses a few words that are obsolete.

#### **Part I – Background / Timeline**

It may not "feel like it," but we are still February of 1923 when *Christianity & Liberalism* is published. Although not mentioned by name in the book, Machen alludes to Harry Emerson Fosdick's sermon, "Shall the Fundamentalists Win" and wrote the book as an answer.





After Machen's Mother Minnie published her book The Bible in Browning, through the popular publisher MacMillan Company. MacMillan became the "family" publisher.

Only 7 chapters Christianity & Liberalism is relatively short book – Machen wastes no words driving he points "sharply and clearly."




