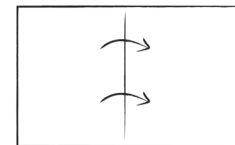
→ Read Matthew 28:18-20: Jesus says: "Go...make disciples"

→ The "411" Training equips Jesus' followers to make disciples by answering these 4 questions in 1 hour (or less) on 1 sheet of paper :

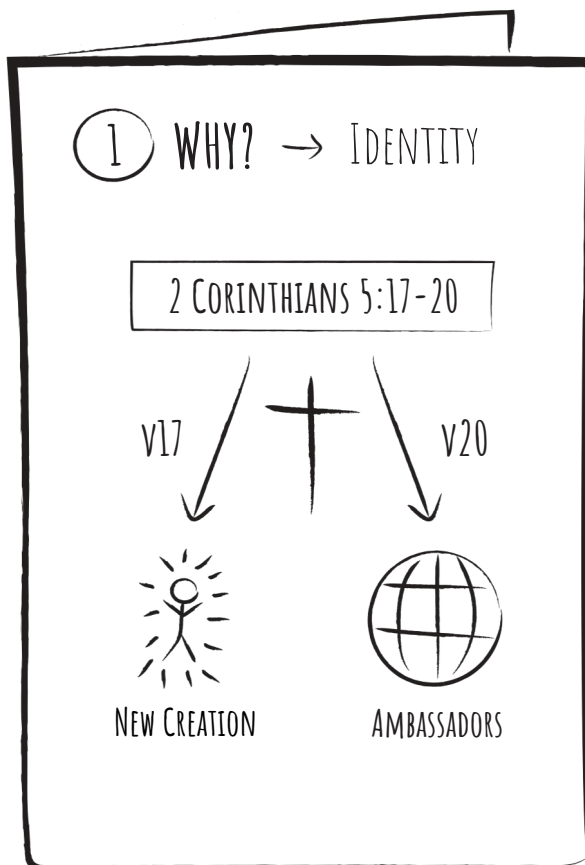
1. **WHY**

→ Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

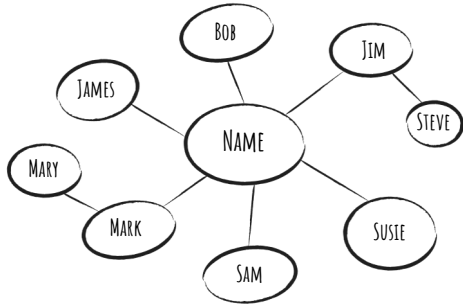
→ **Cross:** We see in these verses that if you are in Christ Jesus, these two things are true of you because of Jesus:

→ **v17 (person)** - You have been made **NEW!** He has forgiven all your sins.

→ **v20 (globe)** - He has given you a new identity as His ambassador.

You cannot separate these two. You cannot become new without being an ambassador of Jesus and you cannot be an ambassador of Jesus without being made new.

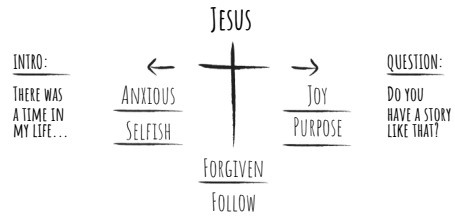

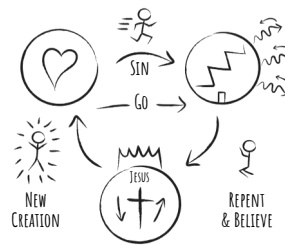

- What do we learn about **God** - His character, actions, or desires?
- What do we learn about **people** - their nature, struggles, or tendencies?
- What is the main message?
- How should this **change** the way I think, feel, or act?
- Who can I **share** this with?

PRACTICE → Retell the passage in your own words.

EXPLORE MORE → What does "**repent**" mean?

- Repent means a change in mind and a change in direction. It means to turn from sin and follow Jesus.

What does "**believe**" mean?

- Believe means choosing to trust Jesus as Lord.

Who needs to repent?

- Read 1 John 1:8-10

What is **assurance**?

- Reread 1 John 1:9. He is faithful to forgive us.

SET GOALS → **Hear:** What does God want you to remember from this passage?
Obey: What does God want you to do to apply his truth?
Share: Who would benefit from hearing this story? When will you tell them?

PLAN → When will this group meet again?

EXPLORE MORE → What is "**baptism**"?

- Romans 6:3-4 explains that baptism is a symbol that we have died to our old life and been raised to a new life in Jesus. It's about identity.

Why should we be baptized?

- Jesus was baptized. Jesus commands it. Getting baptized means we identify with Him.

Who should be baptized?

- Acts 2:38 - everyone (and only those) who repent and believe should be baptized.

How should we be baptized?

- Matthew 3:16 - Jesus went down into the water, fully immersed.

Obey: What does God want you to do to apply his truth?

Share: Who would benefit from hearing this story? When will you tell them?

03. PRAY

EXPLORE MORE → **Why** do we pray?

- Matthew 6:9-13. Jesus models it. God hears. We desire his will on earth. Prayer is how we talk to God.

How do we pray?

- Simply talk to God. God is your heavenly Father. Make the words of the Lord's prayer your own.

Key:

- Our Father = God is your father
- Holy be your name = Worship
- His will = "Lord use me!"
- Daily bread = Ask for your needs
- Forgive us = Confession (1 Jn. 1:9)
- Forgive others = Short accounts
- Deliver us = Trust and protection

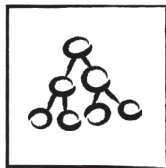

- What do we learn about **God** - His character, actions, or desires?
- What do we learn about **people** - their nature, struggles, or tendencies?
- What is the main message?
- How should this **change** the way I think, feel, or act?

- The church gathers to hear the word, sing the word, pray the word, and love one another.

10. LONG-TERM DISCIPLESHIP

- What do we learn about **people** - their nature, struggles, or tendencies?

PRACTICE → Retell the passage in your own words.

LONG-TERM DISCIPLESHIP

Now that you have finished the short-term discipleship program (Commands of Christ), it's time to move on to "Long-term Discipleship." When you read by yourself, you can continue to use the "Three Thirds" format or the SOAPS Journaling Method (outlined below). The Discovery Questions you've been using will aid you in your Bible exploration. We recommend beginning with the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts. Read one chapter a day, or slower. It's more important to take time to slow down and think through the passage than it is to read in vast quantities. Once you complete your study of Luke and Acts, feel free to continue right into the book of Romans!

SOAPS JOURNALING METHOD

SCRIPTURE:

Write out one or more verses that are particularly meaningful to you, today.

OBSERVATION:

Rewrite those verses or key points in your own words to better understand, or make a list of observations based on the Discovery Questions used in Look Up portion of the 3/3 Discipleship Group

APPLICATION:

Think about what it means to obey these commands in your own life.

PRAYER:

Write out a prayer telling God what you've learned and how you plan to obey.

SHARE:

Ask God who He wants you to share with about what you've learned/applied.

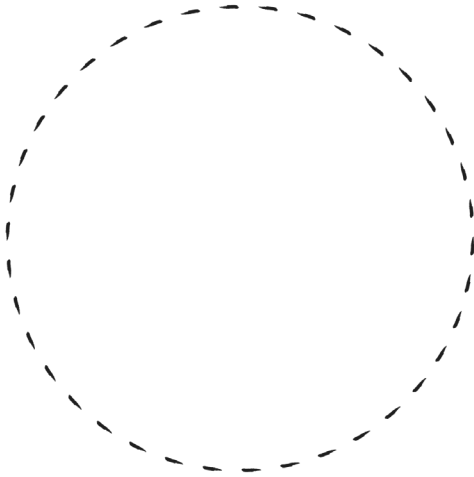

THE CHURCH CIRCLE

1. Draw a dashed circle. This dashed circle represents a gathering of believers.



2. These symbols represent the basic functions of a healthy disciple and church we see in Acts 2:36-47. Some of these functions have already been studied in the lessons, others have simply been practiced week to week without studying a specific lesson on a function (ex. God's Word, Worship).



The arrow represents Jesus' command to **Repent & Believe**. Most draw it outside the circle because this is how one begins a growing relationship with Jesus & is biblically part of His Church.

3. Draw each of the functions which your gathering is consistently practicing inside the circle. Draw the functions which your gathering has not yet practiced outside the circle.



In this example above, the gathering has practiced some very important functions of a church. However, there are a few functions that have yet to be practiced. If your church has yet to practice all the functions, make an action plan to begin practicing them today.

4. If a gathering has identified itself as a "church", then you may make the dashed line solid. The goal is to have a church become healthy and practicing all the functions as modeled by the New Testament Church in Acts 2:36-47.
