STUDENT MINISTRY AND YOUTH ANNOUNCEMENTS

The school year is underway and a new year of student ministry has begun too. This year is particularly exciting with the addition of Josh Dempsey, Director of Middle School Ministries, to our staff. Josh and I desire to serve and love our student families well and present opportunities for students to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Here is what we have scheduled for September and look forward to our time together with our students.

Fall Sunday School Classes

<u>7th Grade: Basic Christian Beliefs</u>, will be held in Room #320 (Josh and Ciera Dempsey) Using Wayne Grudem's Christian Beliefs as a guide. Students will examine and study the essentials of Christian theology. Students will learn about the characteristics of God, being created in the image of God, what God has done for us in Christ, the purpose of the church, and much more.

8th Grade: How to Study the Bible, will be held in Room #321 (Jen Watson and Erika Matney) What does spending time with God look like? Where do we begin when we want to read the Bible? This class will help students answer those questions and more. Students will use and apply what they learned the first quarter in their study of the book of Philippians.

<u>9th-10th Grade: Survey of Genesis and Exodus</u>, will be held in Room #324 (Vance Pickard, Earl Weaver, Moose and Carrie Pierce). Students will study creation, the flood, Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, the Ten Commandments, and so much more! The first two books of the Bible are packed with reminders of God's glory, kindness, faithfulness, justice, and holiness. Students will explore these foundational books and learn about an amazing God who is committed to His people and His glory.

<u>11th-12th Grade: Covenant Theology</u>, will be held in Room #322 (Shane and Laura Whelan). How do we make sense of the Bible? Is there a certain structure that God uses throughout Scripture? Students will learn that God's way with his people is through covenants. The covenant of the Old and New Testaments are central to everything in God's Word and are all tied together and ultimately focus on Jesus Christ.

<u>Rivermont Fellowship Night:</u> Study of Elijah and Elisha: "People Just Like Us". Elijah and Elisha burst into Israel's history at a time of idolatry and evil, and God used them to confront and expose Israel. But these men, just like us, also knew weakness and failure. Not so much as mighty men, but as men serving the mighty God. In God's grace, Elijah and Elisha persevered, and revealed God's mighty sovereignty, grace, power, justice, and salvation. We face the same pressures that Elijah and Elisha experienced. There ups and downs speak to us too. RFN begins Wednesday, September 13.

GLORY THROUGH TRAGEDY IN ECUADOR

In April 2016, Ecuador was hit with a 7.8 magnitude earthquake. A reported 668 people lost their lives and 16,600 were injured. Many gave to Jesus Film Project to provide humanitarian aid and 12 sets of film equipment which was sent to teams and partner ministries caring for the people of Ecuador. Many lives were touched including a young man named Jonathan.

Jonathan had a drug problem and for that reason was ashamed to go to church. But one day a youth leader invited him to a movie dinner at the event room. Because it was not being held in the church, he agreed to go. Jonathan seemed to be enjoying the dinner a lot. He also really liked the movie, "JESUS." At the end, moved by the film, Jonathan made a decision to receive Christ. He left his shame aside and decided to take different steps with his life. After accepting Christ, he asked the youth leader if he could be part of the church.

Here's a summary of the larger impact of the film showing equipment and humanitarian aid that was sent:

- More than 5,000 have come to faith in Christ
- 2,000 new small group fellowships have been formed.
- 196 new churches or missional communities have been established.

Thanks also goes out to those who brought school supplies to benefit the children of **No Walls Ministry**. As usual, Rivermont folks were extremely generous and we collected \$150 in cash as well as a large tub of school supplies, which went directly to our children. Because of you, these children were ready for their first day of class.

PHILEMON PROJECT GROW CENTER GRADUATES NEXT CLASS

Recently the GROW Center Preschool held a graduation ceremony for 28 four year olds who are transitioning into elementary school this fall. The

ceremony was well attended by family and friends of the children. The teachers worked together to present a slide show and video of the kids and various things they have learned, such as their numbers, colors, shapes, etc. The children performed several songs for the guests: "This is the Day" in both English and Arabic was a big hit! The ceremony concluded with the kids receiving their
