**NEW HARPSICHORD:** Rivermont is most grateful to God for the acquisition of the beautiful harpsichord that is being featured in this morning's prelude. The instrument will be a significant asset to our music ministry since we will no longer require a rental or electronic version for pieces requiring a harpsichord. The instrument, built by Peter Watchorn, is a 1995 French double (two keyboards) copy of instruments made by Pascal Taskin (1769). Mr. Watchorn is an Australian-born virtuoso harpsichordist with practical experience in the construction of harpsichords copied from original instruments of the 17th and 18th centuries. Interior paintings on the soundboard were added by Sheridan Germann, an acclaimed scholar and practitioner in the field of harpsichord decoration. Funds for the purchase of this instrument were given to the glory of God by a generous supporter of REPC's music ministry.
