Good News Club is a weekly Bible-based program for children that teaches the gospel of Jesus Christ. The clubs are part of the Child Evangelism Fellowship ministry. Volunteers from Rivermont as well as other local churches meet one day a week after school at Bedford Hills Elementary School to share the good news of Jesus Christ with students, disciple them in the Word of God, and connect them to a local church. Children are taught that God loves them, that every person has value, and that God can help them do the right thing. There are many ways you can help: teaching bible lessons, providing administrative support, leading music, distributing snacks, shepherding students, and praying for students and leaders.
