7th - 12th Grade: The Trinity

The one true and living God eternally exists in three distinct yet inseparable persons. The creeds and confession of the church summarize the essential biblical truths about the triunity of God, providing theological support for this foundational doctrine. Nevertheless, the doctrine of the Trinity has also been frequently misunderstood, misrepresented and perverted. Students will spend three weeks learning about Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and the characteristics that are unique to each one.

October - December

7th - 8th Grade: Gospel Foundations

The gospel is the central message of the Bible and the primary word of Christianity. From Genesis to Revelation, we see a narrative of human sin and failure, alongside divine mercy and redemption. The gospel in ways is very simple. In very basic terms, it involves human sin, divine grace, and the work of Jesus. This study will help students to articulate the gospel accurately in terms of grace, and to share the good news of Christ with the world.

9th - 10th Grade: 1 Peter

Peter's audience was waiting for the return of Jesus. Perhaps they were beginning to wonder if He would even come back at all. As persecution ramped up, they likely were thinking, "Did we get this wrong? Is this all worth it?" How were they supposed to live as the church of Christ in a time such as that? Peter writes to these Christians to give them grounding, hope, and direction in the midst of hard and uncertain times. Much of 1 Peter is guidance about how to live in such a hostile environment.

11th - 12th Grade: Gospel Centered Life
