

# **Introduction to Morning to Evening Prayer**

Before Jesus' death on the cross, He encouraged His disciples that when He leaves, He will send another Helper, the Holy Spirit. Jesus taught that this Spirit will remind them of all His teaching, empower them for mission, and give them words to say as they proclaim the good news that Christ is risen. Ordinary Time is that time after Resurrection where we focus on the ongoing work of the Spirit, who sanctifies and sends the church on mission into the world to declare Christ is King!

Psalm 92 encourages a regular rhythm of prayer from morning to evening. "It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to Your name, O Most High; <sup>2</sup> to declare Your steadfast love in the morning, and Your faithfulness by night. <sup>3</sup> to the music of the lute and the harp, to the melody of the lyre. <sup>4</sup> For You, O Lord, have made me glad by Your work; at the works of Your hands I sing for joy."

As we pray in the morning, we pray with the assurance of God's love and seek His loving guidance each day. We seek direction from the Word of God as a lamp to our feet and a light to our path (Psalm 119:105). This Word of God dwells richly inside us as we pray it in the morning. Midday we continue to seek the Lord in order to make the most of our remaining time with insight and wisdom.

We end the evening with thankfulness for God's faithfulness, reflecting on all His work throughout the day. Remembering God's faithfulness, we often realize our unfaithfulness. As we confess our sins, God forgives and cleanses us through Christ's atoning work, His sacrifice for our sin. We respond with thankfulness for His mercy.

In the Rhythm for Morning to Evening Prayer, you will see the different elements of the Morning, Midday, and Evening Prayer Guides. The bullet points under each element describes how to practice each one. There is a new guide for each week of the month to follow each day: morning, midday, and evening. Daily there is a new morning and evening Psalm, morning Scripture, and midday Proverb. The Sunday Catechism can be found in the index section in the back (pg. 35ff). You may use this guide individually or with a group by having a leader read the plain text and everyone read the bold. This pattern of prayer helps us to be glad in the work of the Lord and to sing for joy in His presence as we seek His guidance.

# **Rhythm for Morning to Evening Prayer**

# Morning Prayer Guide:1

## **† PSALM PRAYER**: Ephesians 5:18-20 (see Psalm Index)

- Praise God for His character and work in the Psalm.
- Seek God based on the words of the Psalm.

# **† SCRIPTURE READING** 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (see Scripture Index)

- Meditation: Read and consider key phrases, prepositions, people, plots, connections, and redemptive themes.
- Adoration: Read and adore God for His great character and kingdom clarified in the verse.
- Confession: Read and confess ways you do not reflect God's character and kingdom in the verse.
- Thanksgiving: Read and give thanks for God's grace, forgiveness, and help in or around the verse (foreshadowed/promised in OT & fulfilled in Christ's life, death and resurrection in NT).
- Application: Read and seek God's guidance in applying the text. Write down the application.

## † **THE GLORIA** Ephesians 1:3

- Sing praise to our Triune God for His holiness, greatness, and presence.

#### **† THE CREED** Titus 1:9

- Hold firm to the trustworthy Word and sound doctrine taught.

#### † THE LORD'S PRAYER Luke 11:1-4

- Recite the Lord's Prayer so that your personal prayer might be shaped by the structure of the Lord's Prayer.

## **PERSONAL PRAYER** Colossians 4:2

(Pray Forward into the day)

- Pray forward into the day, focusing on your schedule, concerns of the day, and updated prayer list.

## **PROMISE FOR THE DAY 2** Corinthians 1:20

- Trust in God's promise of His daily presence and provision as you live out God's mission for the day.

- Sing praise to God because all blessings come from Him.

#### Of the Sacraments

Sacraments are holy signs and seals of the covenant of grace, immediately instituted by God, to represent Christ and His benefits; and to confirm our interest in Him; as also, to put a visible difference between those that belong unto the Church, and the rest of the world; and solemnly to engage them to the service of God in Christ, according to His Word.

The grace which is exhibited in or by the sacraments rightly used, is not conferred by any power in them: neither doth the efficacy of a sacrament depend upon the piety or intention of him that doth administer it:<sup>g</sup> but upon the work of the Spirit,<sup>h</sup> and the word of institution, which contains, together with a precept authorizing the use thereof, a promise of benefit to worthy receivers.<sup>i</sup>

#### 08/02 Chapter 28

## Of Baptism

- 1. Baptism is a sacrament of the New Testament, ordained by Jesus Christ,<sup>a</sup> not only for the solemn admission of the party baptized into the visible Church;<sup>b</sup> but also, to be unto him a sign and seal of the covenant of grace,<sup>c</sup> of his ingrafting into Christ,<sup>d</sup> of regeneration,<sup>e</sup> of remission of sins,<sup>f</sup> and of his giving up unto God through Jesus Christ, to walk in newness of life.<sup>g</sup> Which sacrament is, by Christ's own appointment, to be continued in His Church until the end of the world.<sup>h</sup>

- 2. The outward element to be used in this sacrament is water, wherewith the party is to be baptized, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, by a minister of the gospel, lawfully called thereunto.

- 3. Dipping of the person into the water is not necessary: but baptism is rightly administered by pouring or sprinkling water upon the person.<sup>k</sup>

#### Of Baptism

- 4. Not only those that do actually profess faith in and obedience unto Christ, but also the infants of one or both believing parents, are to be baptized.<sup>m</sup>

## 08/16 Chapter 29

## Of the Lord's Supper

- 1. Our Lord Jesus, in the night wherein He was betrayed, instituted the sacrament of His body and blood, called the Lord's Supper, to be observed in His Church, unto the end of the world, for the perpetual remembrance of the sacrifice of Himself in His death; the sealing all benefits thereof unto true believers, their spiritual nourishment and growth in Him, their further engagement in and to all duties which they owe unto Him; and to be a bond and pledge of their communion with Him, and with each other, as members of His mystical body.<sup>a</sup>

- 2. In this sacrament, Christ is not offered up to His Father; nor any real sacrifice made at all for remission of sins of the quick or dead;<sup>b</sup> but only a commemoration of that one offering up of Himself, by Himself, upon the cross, once for all: and a spiritual oblation of all possible praise unto God for the same:<sup>c</sup> so that the Popish sacrifice of the mass (as they call it) is most abominably injurious to Christ's one, only sacrifice, the alone propitiation for all the sins of His elect.<sup>d</sup>

- 3. The Lord Jesus hath, in this ordinance, appointed His ministers to declare His word of institution to the people; to pray, and bless the elements of bread and wine, and thereby to set them apart from a common to a holy use; and to take and break the bread, to take the cup, and (they communicating also themselves) to give both to the communicants; but to none who are not then present in the congregation.

- 4. Private masses, or receiving this sacrament by a priest or any other alone;<sup>g</sup> as likewise, the denial of the cup to the people,<sup>h</sup> worshipping the elements, the lifting them up or carrying them about for adoration, and the reserving them for any pretended religious use; are all contrary to the nature of this sacrament, and to the institution of Christ.<sup>i</sup>

#### 08/23 Chapter 29 (Continued)

#### Of the Lord's Supper

- 5. The outward elements in this sacrament, duly set apart to the uses ordained by Christ, have such relation to Him crucified, as that, truly, yet sacramentally only, they are sometimes called by the name of the things they represent, to wit, the body and blood of Christ;<sup>k</sup> albeit in substance and nature they still remain truly and only bread and wine, as they were before.<sup>l</sup> k)Matt 26:26-28. l1 Cor 11:26-28; Matt 26:29.
- 6. That doctrine which maintains a change of the substance of bread and wine into the substance of Christ's body and blood (commonly called transubstantiation) by consecration of a priest, or by any other way, is repugnant, not to Scripture alone, but even to common sense and reason; overthroweth the nature of the sacrament, and hath been, and is the cause of manifold superstitions; yea, of gross idolatries.<sup>m</sup>

- 7. Worthy receivers outwardly partaking of the visible elements in this sacrament, do then also, inwardly by faith, really and indeed, yet not carnally and corporally, but spiritually, receive and feed upon Christ crucified, and all benefits of His death: the body and blood of Christ being then, not corporally or carnally, in, with, or under the bread and wine; yet, as really, but spiritually, present to the faith of believers in that ordinance, as the elements themselves are to their outward senses.º

- 8. Although ignorant and wicked men receive the outward elements in this sacrament: yet they receive not the thing signified thereby, but by their unworthy coming thereunto are guilty of the body and blood of the Lord to their own damnation. Wherefore, all ignorant and ungodly persons, as they are unfit to enjoy communion with Him, so are they unworthy of the Lord's table; and cannot, without great sin against Christ while they remain such, partake of these holy mysteries,<sup>p</sup> or be admitted thereunto.<sup>q</sup> p)1 Cor 11:27-29; 2 Cor 6:14-16.

#### 08/30 Chapter 30

#### **Of Church Censures**

- 1. The Lord Jesus, as King and Head of His Church, hath therein appointed a government, in the hand of Church officers, distinct from the civil magistrate.a

To these officers, the keys of the kingdom of heaven are committed: by virtue whereof, they have power respectively to retain, and remit sins; to shut that kingdom against the impenitent, both by the Word and censures; and to open it unto penitent sinners, by the ministry of the gospel, and by absolution from censures, as occasion shall require.<sup>b</sup>

- 3. Church censures are necessary, for the reclaiming and gaining of offending brethren, for deterring of others from the like offences, for purging out of that leaven which might infect the whole lump, for vindicating the honour of Christ, and the holy profession of the gospel, and for preventing the wrath of God, which might justly fall upon the Church, if they should suffer His covenant and the seals thereof to be profaned by notorious and obstinate offenders.<sup>c</sup>

- 4. For the better attaining of these ends, the officers of the Church are to proceed by admonition; suspension from the sacrament of the Lord's Supper for a season; and by excommunication from the Church; according to the nature of the crime, and demerit of the person.<sup>d</sup>

#### 09/06 Chapter 31

#### Of Synods and Councils

- 1. For the better government, and further edification of the Church, there ought to be such assemblies as are commonly called synods or councils.<sup>a</sup> a) Acts 15:2,4,6.
- 2. As magistrates may lawfully call a synod of ministers, and other fit persons, to consult and advise with, about matters of religion;<sup>b</sup> so, if magistrates be open enemies to the Church, the ministers of Christ of themselves, by virtue of their office, or they, with other fit persons, upon delegation from their Churches, may meet together in such assemblies.<sup>c</sup> b) <u>Isa 49:23; 1 Tim 2:1-2; 2 Chron 19:8-11; 2 Chron 29-30; Matt 2:4-5; Prov 11:14.</u> c) <u>Acts 15:2,4,22-23,25</u>.
- 3. It belongeth to synods and councils, ministerially to determine controversies of faith and cases of conscience, to set down rules and directions for the better ordering of the public worship of God and government of His Church; to receive complaints in cases of maladministration, and authoritatively to determine the same: which decrees and determinations, if consonant to the Word of God, are to be received with reverence and submission; not only for their agreement with the Word, but also for the power whereby they are made, as being an ordinance of God appointed thereunto in His Word.<sup>d</sup>

- 4. All synods or councils, since the Apostles' times, whether general or particular, may err; and many have erred. Therefore they are not to be made the rule of faith or practice; but to be used as a help in both.

Synods and councils are to handle, or conclude, nothing, but that which is ecclesiastical: and are not to intermeddle with civil affairs which concern the commonwealth; unless by way of humble petition, in cases extraordinary; or by way of advice, for satisfaction of conscience, if they be thereunto required by the civil magistrate.<sup>f</sup>

#### 09/13 Chapter 32

#### Of the State of Men After Death, and of the Resurrection of the Dead

The bodies of men, after death, return to dust and see corruption: <sup>a</sup>but their souls (which neither die nor sleep) having an immortal subsistence, immediately return to God who gave them: <sup>b</sup> the souls of the righteous, being then made perfect in holiness, are received into the highest heavens, where they behold the face of God, in light and glory, waiting for the full redemption of their bodies. <sup>c</sup> And the souls of the wicked are cast into hell, where they remain in torments and utter darkness, reserved to the judgment of the great day. <sup>d</sup> Beside these two places, for souls separated from their bodies, the Scripture acknowledgeth none.

The end of God's appointing this day is for the manifestation of the glory of His mercy, in the eternal salvation of the elect; and of His justice, in the damnation of the reprobate who are wicked and disobedient. For then shall the righteous go into everlasting life, and receive that fulness of joy and refreshing, which shall come from the presence of the Lord: but the wicked, who know not God, and obey not the gospel of Jesus Christ, shall be cast into eternal torments, and be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of His power.<sup>c</sup>

As Christ would have us to be certainly persuaded that there shall be a day of judgment, both to deter all men from sin, and for the greater consolation of the godly in their adversity; so will He have that day unknown to men, that they may shake off all carnal security, and be always watchful, because they know not at what hour the Lord will come; and may be ever prepared to say, Come, Lord Jesus, come quickly, Amen.<sup>g</sup>
