Sermon Discussion Questions: The Everlasting Kingdom of Christ (Psalm 72:8-11) Epiphany Sunday January 5th, 2019

1.	What in the sermon encouraged you, comforted you, challenged you, or informed you?
2.	It has been said that power corrupts, and absolute power corrupts absolutely. Yet, Psalm 72:8 reveals that this coming king, King Jesus, "has dominion from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth!" Looking throughout Psalm 72 what do we learn of the character of this King and His work? How does this character keep Him from leading corruptly?
3.	There is a common myth that one can trust in Jesus as savior and disobey Him as Lord. Why must those who trust in Jesus as Savior submit to Him as Lord (Consider verses quoted in the sermon)? What areas of your life do you struggle to submit to Christ as Lord?
4.	On Epiphany Sunday we commemorate the three wise men from different nations who came to worship Jesus. Identify some people with whom you would like to share the Gospel this year? How might you build this relationship, establish trust, welcome them into your life and the church, and share the Gospel with them?
5.	There are many excellent resources to pray for unreached people groups around the world. An unreached people group is a people group that has less than 2% of confessing believers in Christ and lack enough followers and resources to reach their people group.
