July was another busy month for Northern Cross, but that was a very blessed thing for us! We had two mission groups here from the United States and they accomplished many upkeep projects around our property that needed to be done. There were also many opportunities for the teams to interact with the local population and see firsthand the difficulties of doing ministry in this region of Canada. We are all very thankful for all the hard work the mission teams have done and we praise God for such giving hearts within His wonderful Kingdom.



FBC Finchville (Kentucky) sponsored a mission trip to Goose Bay and a team of eight came to serve with Northern Cross. Their journey was delayed by two full days due to airline cancellations, so they made the most of the four days they had with us. They were the fourth team to come here in 2025 and we are very thankful for all the work they did.

A church in Florida purchased two new signs for Northern Cross and the Finchville team took down the old one and installed the new ones in front of the church building. It was not an easy task, but the team accomplished it without too much trouble. Every little project is noticed by the local community and hopefully helps to encourage more people to come attend one of our services.



Another sizeable task the team accomplished was steam cleaning the carpets in the building. We rented a carpet cleaning machine and the team was able to do the entire building within three days. It was not an easy task and it took a good amount of cleaning agents to finish, but they completed it. The carpets had probably not been cleaned for the past 15 years, so we were especially thankful for their efforts here.



We took half a day and brought the team out to the Birch Island Conservation area where they could walk along the Churchill River and take the boardwalk around the small island. Afterwards we went up to North West River so they could see the only nearby community that is accessible by road. It helps the team get a sense of the remoteness of these communities and the difficulties in reaching them with the Gospel.



After the Finchville team departed about six days later a team from Living Faith Fellowship in Fayetteville, Georgia arrived to serve along with Northern Cross. There are six people in the team and at the time of this newsletter they are still here helping us. We have had cooler than normal temperatures for this time of year and this team have been loving it. They immediately got to work in completing tasks around our church building and property, which helps us tremendously.



The first project was additional wood staining that included a large cross we have in the sanctuary. The ladies were able to complete this very quickly and allow it to dry before we had a rain shower later. It looks absolutely wonderful and we are thankful that this is done!



There were a few projects where woodworking skills were needed and the team accomplished them all. They finished the sound booth that was started by FBC Biloxi in May and completed the baptismal room that needed the stairs finished and handrails installed. Again, we are so very thankful for their efforts in completing these tasks for NCCC.



As we enter August the team is still here working with us to finish more projects and reach out into the community to invite more folks to worship services at NCCC. We thank God tremendously for these teams and pray for additional teams to come serve with us in the near future. If your church is interested, please reach out to us!
