Sovereignty and Suffering

- Suffering is inevitable
- Job 5:7
- We can accept suffering as an idea, but tend to struggle when it touches us
- "God knew it was going to happen" and "God is sovereign" (we may need to go deeper than that when we comfort or exhort)
- We need a God who not only knows, but who is good, who has a plan, and who has the power to carry it out

Eight Ways God Sovereignly Makes Us Useful Through Suffering

- 1) To turn us from sin
 - Hebrews 12:11, Psalm 32:3-5, Hebrews 12:6, Psalm 119:67
- 2) To test and demonstrate our faith
 - o 1 Peter 1:6-9
- 3) To expose weaknesses
 - James 1:2-5
- 4) To build godly character
 - John 15:1-3, Romans 5:3, 2 Corinthians 12:7
- 5) To enable us to comfort others who are suffering
 - o 2 Corinthians 1:3-5
- 6) To make us more effective in ministry
 - Philippians 1:12-14
- 7) To build our confidence in God
 - o 1 Peter 5:6-10
- 8) To display His character
 - Jonah- God's mercy displayed through the suffering of a disobedient prophet
 - Joseph- God's mercy displayed through an obedient man (Genesis 50:19-20)
