

Philippians 4:4-9

- 4** Rejoice in the Lord always;
again I will say, rejoice!
- 5** Let your **gentle spirit** be known
to all men. **The Lord is near.**
- 6** **Be anxious for nothing,**
but in everything **by prayer** and
supplication with thanksgiving
let your requests be made known to God.
- 7** And the **peace of God**, which surpasses
all comprehension, **shall guard** your
hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- 8** Finally, brethren, whatever is true,
whatever is honorable,
whatever is right,
whatever is pure,
whatever is lovely,
whatever is of good repute,
if there is any excellence and
if anything worthy of praise,
let your mind dwell on these things.
- 9** The things you have learned and received
and heard and seen in me,
practice these things,
and the **God of Peace** shall be with you.

Wuest Literal Greek Translation: Phil 4:4-9

4 Be rejoicing in the Lord always. Again, I say, be rejoicing. **5** Let your sweet reasonableness, your forbearance, your being satisfied with less than your due, become known to all men. The Lord is near [in that His coming may occur any moment]. **6** Stop worrying about even one thing, but in everything by prayer whose essence is that of worship and devotion and by supplication which is a cry for your personal needs, with thanksgiving let your requests for the things asked for be made known in the presence of God, **7** and the peace of God which surpasses all power of comprehension shall mount guard over your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. **8** Finally, brethren, whatever things have the character of truth, whatever things are worthy of reverence, whatever things are righteous, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are attractive, whatever excellence there is or fit object of praise, these things make the subject of careful reflection. **9** The things also which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these things habitually practice, and the God of peace shall be with you.
