- The Sufficiency of the Scriptures
 - o 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - Though we claim to trust the Scriptures, we sometimes hold extrabiblical ideas in practice
 - Illustration
 - We need to be careful to draw a clear line between truth and opinion
 - There are medical theories about connections between anxiety/depression and physiological causes
 - So we should focus on what we know. The Scriptures make a clear claim that they are sufficient for life and godliness.

- o 2 Peter 1:3
- o Colossians 2:1-8
- All of these doctrines of Scripture help give us the confidence to know we have the mind of Christ, so we can walk in wisdom
- o Switching gears- our view of God
- Q: What is the first and most fundamental biblical conviction that leads us to bow the heart in full submission to God?
 - o Proverbs 9:10
 - o The fear of God
 - What's the difference between a low view and a high view of God?
 - o A high view of God also results in a recognition of His sovereignty
- What is sovereignty? Psalm 103:19
 - o LORD- Yahweh- I AM
 - o Throne- the seat of power for the King
 - o In the heavens- a throne above all earthly thrones
 - o Colossians 1:16-17, Proverbs 21:1, Acts 17:26, Isaiah 14:27
