## I Got My Eye on You

One day last week I was asked an interesting question. You see, this person has a cat who will come meow in their ear while they are sleeping. The question: how does the cat know where to go to make noise that we can hear? Hmmm. Good question. But of course that got me to thinking. Animals, for the most part, will make eye contact with us humans. The dog that wants to play isn't watching your feet or your hands, but is watching your face. We might not understand how animals know, but even they comprehend the importance of the connection.

Eye contact is so important. We do so many things with it. We see if the other person is paying attention to us, and likewise we see if they are distracted. If we, looking at their eyes, see that they are looking at something else, we can sometimes figure out what they are looking at. We also detect a number of emotions through eye contact, such as compassion, laughter, anger, fear, bitterness, and disgust. Sometimes, when we know the other person really well, we can even communicate with them just using our eyes.

David wrote concerning God, "Keep me as the apple of the eye, hide me under the shadow of thy wings" (Psalm 17:8, KJV). The apple of the eye refers to the reflection one can see in the eye of another, but you have to be close to see it. Really close. That is what David was after, having God keep him so close that God could see His own reflection in David's eye. And he declared in Psalm 34:15, "The eyes of the LORD are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry." God has His eyes on you.

But what is God looking at when His eyes are on us? Is He checking to see if we are paying attention (or are our eyes only on our phones)? Is He seeing the emotions that too often overwhelm us? Is He seeing if our eyes are focused on ourselves or if they are focused on others? And what should we see in the anthropomorphic eyes of God, if not love, mercy, compassion, forgiveness, and tender care?

God says, I have my eyes on you. Do we have our eyes upon Him?
