Resolution Suggestion #11— Don't Let Your Life Be Defined by a Bad Day

We probably have more in common with Balaam than we would prefer to admit. Granted, I've never had a donkey, much less had one talk to me, but think about what put Balaam on the donkey to begin with. Balaam was selfish, greedy, egotistical, and stubborn. And those things all combined to block out the one good quality he possessed: the knew the power of the Word of God. He told the servants of Balak up front, "Though Balak were to give me his house full of silver and gold, I could not go beyond the word of the LORD my God, to do less or more" (Numbers 22:18). Balaam decided, however, to try to deny that power.

We've all been there. While it's extremely doubtful that we've attempted to curse the people of God like Balaam did, we have all had days when we knew good and well what God wanted us to do, but instead we chose to do what we wanted to do. You would think Balaam would have learned. Not once or twice, but four times Balaam tried to curse God's people. When the Israelites finally went to battle against Midian in Numbers 31, we read this simple but very sad statement in verse 8: "Balaam the son of Beor they also killed with the sword." Balaam knew better, but he persisted until his defiance of God defined who he was and his destiny.

I'm not saying Balaam was a good person, but he could have been much better. He obviously knew God, and he knew what God expected of him. You would think that after all those failed attempts to curse Israel (plus the talking donkey) would have led him down a different path, but it didn't. In his case, pride mingled with his greed and stubbornness to prevent him from straightening out.

Sometimes we have a bad day. Sometimes we're in the wrong place at the wrong time. Or sometimes we make the wrong choices, and that leaves us in a predicament. We know others are watching and have seen us stumble. Are we going to let that event define who we are from that point forward? Let's resolve to humble ourselves and let Him lift us up (James 4:10) instead of trying to prop ourselves up with our own stubbornness and self will.
