Open Wide

When God gave the Law of Moses to the Israelites, He was doing so with the aim of building a nation. The Law served to show a people who had grown up as slaves how to be responsible citizens. There are a lot of things in the Law of Moses that we look at as "common sense," but only because we were reared in an organized society that already had many of these principles in place. God was largely starting from scratch with these people.

One interesting thing to note about the civil ordinances in the Law of Moses is that the only central organization or entity was the Levitical priesthood. There was no police, no fire department, no public utilities, no DFS, only the priesthood. Their form of a government was a theocracy, with God being their head, their protector, and their provider. Government wasn't going to do "it" for them (whatever "it" was); God would.

But within God's framework were things that God was taking care of by telling them to take care of themselves. For example, Deuteronomy 15:11. "For the poor will never cease from the land; therefore I command you, saying, 'You shall open your hand wide to your brother, to your poor and your needy, in your land." (NKJV) Much of Deuteronomy 15 addresses that there will always be those who are poor, and God said to take care of them. This wasn't to be a responsibility of the state, but the responsibility of neighbors.

I want to be clear that this is not meant to criticize government for taking care of needs. If that is something that government wants to do, government certainly has the right to do so, and many people are blessed by its help. The aid of the government, however, does not take away the individual responsibility of godly people to act as good citizens and neighbors...and Jesus.

Paul wrote in Galatians 6:2, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." James said, "If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF," you do well" (James 2:8). Likewise, John: "And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also" (1 John 4:21).

Therefore today, just as well as then, "You shall open you hand wide to your brother, to your poor and your needy, in your land." ~ Keith Olbricht
