That One Day

A few days ago I was outside early in the morning and I heard the familiar sound of sirens being tested down at the fire station. As a former paramedic, I remember those days well. There was a list of things that had to be checked at every shift change: batteries, engine oil, tire pressures, fuel, lights, and of course, the siren. It didn't matter if the truck had just returned from a run. It didn't matter if dogs would howl and neighbors would be annoyed. The siren was on the list to be checked, and it was checked every day, and every day it would work.

Until there was that one day that it didn't. The switch was flipped and...click. That was it. Nothing happened. And just like that, surrounded by the sound of silence, that truck was instantly out of service and unavailable for emergency calls. Everything else still worked. It was an expensive vehicle specifically designed and equipped to save lives. It could go, it could be seen, and it could do things no other vehicle could do, but it had no voice, and without that voice, its power to save had been effectively removed and it was not doing anything but taking up space in the garage.

Think about John the Baptist. He was a prophet. He looked like a prophet (Mark 1:6; 2 Kings 1:8; Zechariah 13:4). He ate like a prophet (Mark 1:6). But most importantly, he talked like a prophet (Mark 1:3, 7). The voice was what made all the difference. Then came Jesus without those distinguishing characteristics of a prophet (Matthew 11:18-19), but His voice set Him apart from everyone else (John 7:46).

What if we look like Christians, have faith like Christians, serve like Christians, walk like Christians, dress like Christians, eat like Christians, but we don't have a voice? What if everything else works, but (to paraphrase Romans 10:18), our sound hasn't gone out to all the earth, and our words haven't gone to the ends of the world? Then the gospel's power to save has effectively been removed. Christians are expensive (Acts 20:28; Ephesians 1:14), but without a voice, aren't we just taking up space on a pew?
