I Am What I Am

How would you like to be stuck on an island with a bunch of lazy, evil liars? That is exactly where Titus found himself. Paul left him on the island of Crete, and this was the self-described state of things there (Titus 1:5, 12). Paul essentially wrote to him and said, I know it, you know it, and they know it: don't let them get away with it. And he used some pretty strong language in Titus 1 to emphasize this. "But," the Cretans might have said, "that's just the way we are." Or some might have even said, "But that's the way God made us."

"To the pure all things are pure, but to those who are defiled and unbelieving nothing is pure; but even their mind and conscience are defiled. They profess to know God, but in works they deny Him, being abominable, disobedient, and disqualified for every good work." (Titus 1:15-16)

We might not all be lazy, evil liars like the Cretans, but we all certainly have flaws. Excuses are easy to offer, and one of our favorites is, "That's just the way I am." We can convince ourselves that if I know it, you know it, and God knows it, it must be all right. If, however, we want to be sound in the faith (Titus 1:13), we can't let ourselves get away with it, but instead abide in those things "which are proper for sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1).
