Good Friday April 7, 2023 – 12 Noon *The Way of the Cross*



The ancient title for this day—the triumph of the cross—reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day, but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life. In the ancient bidding prayer we offer petitions for all the world for whom Christ died. The offering will be received at the door as you leave the sanctuary, or by giving online at <u>https://www.sjlc.com/give</u>.

As a sign of repentance as we leave the house of God, worshipers may come forward at the close of the service and place a nail (available at the sanctuary doors) into the cross. By doing so, we confess and acknowledge that it was our sin which nailed Jesus to the cross.

Passion Reading

Matthew 27:45-56

A reading from the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ, according to St. Matthew. Glory to you, O Lord.

Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. ⁴⁶ And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" ⁴⁷ And some of the bystanders, hearing it, said, "This man is calling Elijah." ⁴⁸ And one of them at once ran and took a sponge, filled it with sour wine, and put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink. ⁴⁹ But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him." ⁵⁰ And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit. ⁵¹ And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the earth shook, and the rocks were split. ⁵² The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, ⁵³ and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many. ⁵⁴ When the centurion and those who were with him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said, "Truly this was the Son of God!" ⁵⁵ There were also many women there, looking on from a distance, who had followed Jesus from Galilee, ministering to him, ⁵⁶ among whom were Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph and the mother of the sons of Zebedee.

L Let us pray for the whole Christian Church, that our Lord God would defend her against all the assaults and temptations of the adversary and keep her perpetually on the true foundation, Jesus Christ:

Silent prayer

Almighty and everlasting God, since You have revealed Your glory to all nations in Jesus Christ and in the Word of His truth, keep, we ask You, in safety the works of Your mercy so that Your Church, spread throughout all the nations, may be defended against the adversary and may serve You in true faith and persevere in the confession of Your name; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C Amen.

L Let us pray for all the ministers of the Word, for all vocations in the Church, and for all the people of God:

Silent prayer

P Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified, receive the supplications and prayers which we offer before You for all Your servants in Your holy Church that every member of the same may truly serve You according to Your calling; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C Amen.

Let us pray for our catechumens, that our Lord God would open their hearts and the door of His mercy that, having received the remission of all their sins by the washing of regeneration, they may be mindful of their Baptism and evermore be found in Christ Jesus, our Lord:

Silent prayer

- Almighty God and Father, because You always grant growth to Your Church, increase the faith and understanding of our catechumens that, rejoicing in their new birth by the water of Holy Baptism, they may forever continue in the family of those whom You adopt as Your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.

Let us pray for all in authority that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty:

Silent prayer

- P O merciful Father in heaven, because You hold in Your hand all the might of man and because You have ordained, for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of those who do well, all the powers that exist in all the nations of the world, we humbly pray You graciously to regard Your servants, especially Joseph, our President; the Congress of the United States; Glenn, our Governor; and all those who make, administer, and judge our laws; that all who receive the sword as Your ministers may bear it according to Your Word; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.
- Let us pray our Lord God Almighty that He would deliver the world from all error, take away disease, deliver from violence and bloodshed, ward off famine, set free those in bondage, and grant health to the sick and a safe journey to all who travel:

Silent prayer

- P Almighty and everlasting God, the consolation of the sorrowful and the strength of the weak, may the prayers of those who in any tribulation or distress cry to You graciously come before You, so that in all their necessities they may rejoice in Your manifold help and comfort; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.
- L Let us pray for all who are outside the Church, that our Lord God would be pleased to deliver them from their error, call them to faith in the true and living God and His only Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, and gather them into His family, the Church:

Silent prayer

- P Almighty and everlasting God, because You seek not the death but the life of all, hear our prayers for all who have no right knowledge of You, free them from their error, and for the glory of Your name bring them into the fellowship of Your holy Church; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.
- L Let us pray for peace, that we may come to the knowledge of God's holy Word and walk before Him as is fitting for Christians:

Silent prayer

- Almighty and everlasting God, King of Glory, and Lord of heaven and earth, by whose Spirit all things are goverened, by whose providence all things are ordered, the God of peace and the author of all concord, grant us, we implore You, Your heavenly peace and concord that we may serve You in true fear, to the praise and glory of Your name; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.
- **L** Let us pray for our enemies, that God would remember them in mercy and graciously grant them such things as are needful for them and profitable for their salvation:

Silent prayer

- P O almighty, everlasting God, through Your only Son, our blessed Lord, You have commanded us to love our enemies, to do good to those who hate us, and to pray for those who persecute us. We therefore earnestly implore You that by Your gracious visitation all our enemies may be led to true repentance and may have the same love and be of one accord and one mind and heart with us and with Your whole Christian Church; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.
- L Let us pray for the fruits of the earth, that God would send down His blessing upon them and graciously dispose our hearts to enjoy them according to His own good will:

Silent prayer

- O Lord, Father Almighty, by Your Word You created and You continue to bless and uphold all things. We pray You so to reveal to us Your Word, our Lord Jesus Christ that, through His dwelling in our hearts, we may by Your grace be made ready to receive Your blessing on all the fruits of the earth and whatsoever pertains to our bodily need; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C Amen.
- **I** Finally, let us pray for all things for which our Lord would have us ask, saying:
- Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Tolling Bell

Those who desire may come forward to offer a sign of reverence, such as touching the cross, kneeling briefly, or placing a nail in the cross. You are invited to remain after the worship service and spend time in prayer. Please depart in silence.

Holy Saturday April 8

The Great Vigil of Easter is one of the most beautiful and moving services of the entire year. We light the new fire of Easter outside, process into the darkened Sanctuary for the service of readings, celebrate Holy Baptism, and conclude with receiving the risen Savior in the Lord's Supper in the Easter Vigil service which begins at 7:30 p.m.

Easter Sunday April 9

Festival Worship for the Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Sunday, will be celebrated with two worship services at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. A brass ensemble will provide glorious music to lead us in singing praises to our risen Lord Jesus Christ. For those unable to attend, the 10:30 a.m. service will be live streamed.

Between the two worship services an Easter Breakfast will be served in the Fellowship Hall and an Easter Egg Hunt for children up to the age of 12 will begin.

On Easter Sunday, remember to bring spring flowers to "flower" the cross located in the church entrance!
