Opening Sentences

P Through Holy Baptism, our gracious God forgives sin and creates new life. In Baptism, we are reborn to a new life where we know God as the loving, forgiving Father that He is. By the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, we become inheritors of eternal life through the cleansing blood of Jesus, shed for us and for our salvation.




Commendation

Edwin Felipe Chanco Pena, 70 years of age, passed away peacefully after a lingering illness at the Mt. Vernon Hospital.

His career as a banker started after he earned his degree of Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the De La Salle University in Manila, Philippines.

He lived a very active life and indulged in several sports like tennis, soccer and softball. He even had a short stint as an amateur speed boat racer. His friendly and helpful demeanor earned him a lot of lifelong friends. He loved to entertain and host parties with his wife, Marissa at their residence in Alexandria, Virginia.

In April 1996, he contracted a rare and relatively unknown disease at that time, called acute transverse myelitis. It rendered him paralyzed and he lived as a quadriplegic for 29.5 years.

Marissa, and with the help of church friends, volunteers and caregivers, Edwin lived a normal happy life that at times could be bumpy but his positive outlook in life and his strong faith in God carried him through.

He is survived by his loving wife, Marissa Ona, his siblings, Adriel, Louella, Glenda, Pedro Jr., and Rebecca. His parents were the late Pedro Roque Pena and Rebecca Chanco Pena and had a deceased brother, Dino.
