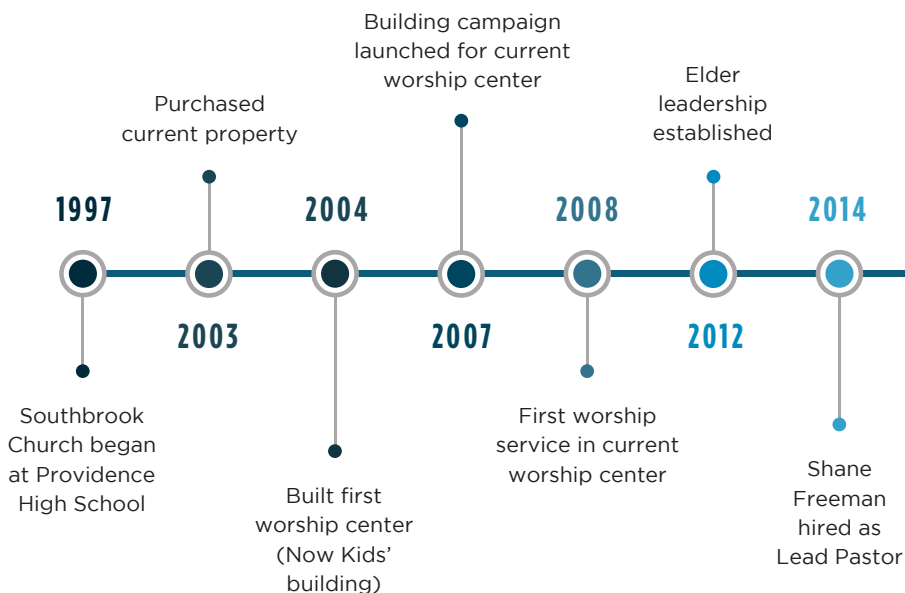

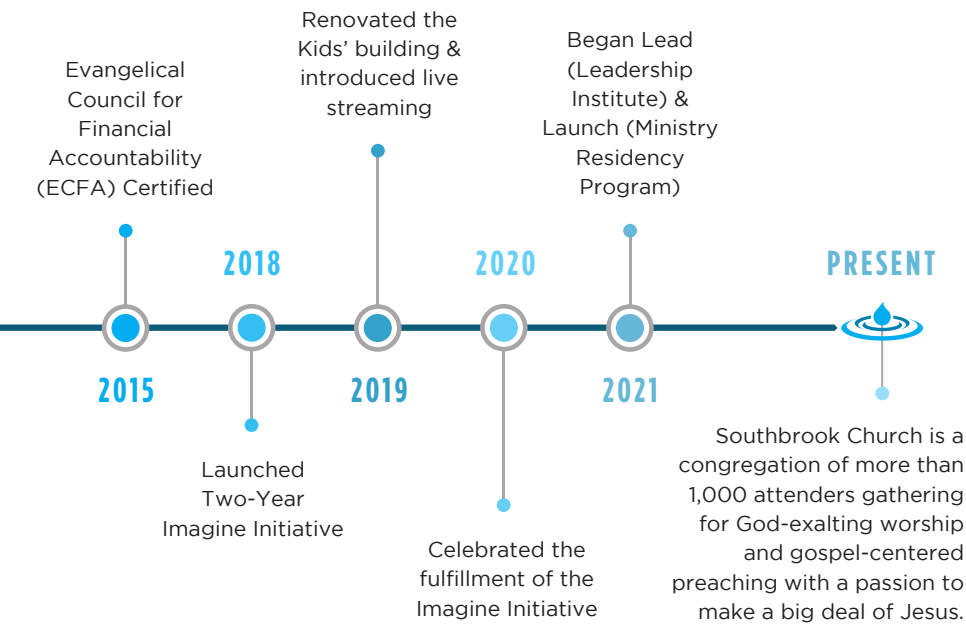

# OUR HEART

FOR PEOPLE; FOR THE FUTURE



Our heart is to be:

- **A church committed** to helping people take their next step as disciples of Jesus
- **A church committed** to equipping lay leaders to lead within local churches
- **A church committed** to training those who have been called to full-time vocational ministry
- **A church committed** to sending people to go with the gospel (locally through church plants and globally through missions)
- **A church committed** to growing our support of ministry partners both in our community and around the world



# MULTIPLY

Multiply is a two-year generosity initiative focused on helping us multiply our gospel influence. Each of us will have the opportunity to participate in God's mission of advancing the gospel by practicing sacrificial generosity. This will require each of us to seek the Lord and trust His provision. As we're challenged in this area, let's be open and responsive to how God might want to grow us as disciples as we continue to fulfill our mission of making disciples.

The resources needed to accomplish all aspects of our mission will be provided through individuals and families making a two-year financial commitment. These contributions will be used to continue the existing ministry of Southbrook Church, begin new ministry by funding church plants, and create additional ministry capacity by reducing our mortgage debt.

## **PRIORITY ONE**

### **EXISTING MINISTRY**

#### *Continue the existing ministry of Southbrook Church*

God has done some amazing things in and through Southbrook Church. However, we know there is more He wants to do, so we are committed to continuing to be a gospel-centered church whose focus is to make disciples who make disciples.

## **PRIORITY TWO**

### **CHURCH PLANTING**

#### *Begin new ministry by funding church plants*

Rather than focusing all of our time, energy, and resources on Southbrook alone, we want to also focus on starting self-sustaining, Bible-preaching, disciple-making churches that share Southbrook's culture, heart and passion for gospel-centered ministry. By planting churches in other communities around the Charlotte region, there is great potential to see our gospel influence multiply.

## **PRIORITY THREE**

### **DEBT REDUCTION**

#### *Create additional ministry capacity by reducing our mortgage debt*

There is no limit to what God can do through Southbrook Church; however, our gospel impact will be limited as long as we bear financial debt. We believe that by continuing to reduce debt, and eventually eliminating it, we will equip and release more disciples locally, regionally, and globally.



## WHAT WILL I BE ASKED TO DO?

### Continue to grow as a disciple in taking your next step in the area of generosity!

Each of us will be asked to prayerfully consider our financial stewardship and commit to investing a portion of what God has given to us in His kingdom over the two-year period of the initiative. For some, this commitment may involve giving for the first time. For others, it may involve beginning to give consistently for the first time. For others, it may involve beginning to give sacrificially for the first time. For all of us, it will involve stepping out in faith as we respond in obedience to what God calls us to. It may feel uncomfortable at times, but what a privilege we have to participate in what God is doing! And remember, we won't be alone, and we won't regret playing a part in multiplying the influence of the gospel!

## MOVING TO THE NEXT STEP

To make Multiply a reality, everyone at Southbrook will be challenged to participate and contribute in some way. Before beginning any journey, you must identify two things: where you are and where you want to go. The Generosity Journey is a gauge to assess where you are and where you may be challenged to grow. Generosity happens one step at a time.

# GENEROSITY JOURNEY

## 4

### **SACRIFICIAL** *2 Samuel 24:18-25*

These givers' commitment to giving actually shapes their lifestyle in ways that require them to adjust the rest of their expenditures to meet that commitment.

## 5

### **LIFETIME** *1 Timothy 6:6-19*

Much like the sacrificial givers, these givers make a lifetime or long-term commitment to evaluate and govern their financial decisions through the lens of generous giving.

## 3

### **INTENTIONAL** *Luke 14:28-35*

These givers choose to rearrange their spending in order to make giving a larger part of their monthly budget.

## 2

### **CONSISTENT** *2 Corinthians 9:6-8*

These givers decide to give on a consistent basis. This requires planning and discipline to give regularly.

## 1

### **INITIAL** *2 Corinthians 8:7-15*

These givers decide to give for the first time and trust God with their gift.

# HOW CAN I HELP?



## **PRAY**

Pray with us. Pray as a family. Ask God to stir your heart and show you exactly how you are to participate in this initiative in order to multiple your gospel influence.



## **ENGAGE**

Engage in the various events we will host in order to help you gain clarity as to the why behind this initiative and to have the opportunity to ask questions of leadership.



## **COMMIT**

Commit to being involved in a Community Group so you can participate in the small group aspect of this initiative and be encouraged to trust God with your resources as you hear from others.



## **BE PRESENT**

Be present at our weekend services throughout February and March. This is the primary environment where you will hear God's word taught and applied to this initiative.



## **TRUST GOD**

Trust God by growing your generosity. This is a discipleship opportunity for all of us to trust God to move, work, and equip us as we multiply our gospel influence.



## MAKE A COMMITMENT

On Commitment Sunday, March 27, 2022, everyone in the church will be given the opportunity to turn in a commitment card for a two-year financial commitment. This commitment is for your total giving; including what you regularly give over two years plus any “expanded giving” you will give toward Multiply.

As disciples of Jesus, may we never waver in our urgency to multiply our gospel influence by making more disciples. ## STUDY QUESTIONS

1. Spend some time celebrating what God has done in your life, personally. In addition, talk about how you've seen God work through Southbrook Church during your time here. Read Deuteronomy 8:11-17. Take a few minutes to pause and praise God for His grace and provision.
2. Churches can sometimes get so busy managing present-day needs that they fail to prayerfully seek God for the future. Read Matthew 28:16-20. Why is it important for churches to have a sense of urgency when it comes to fulfilling God's mission in the world? Explain. Consider what living urgently might look like for you as well as for our church. Discuss these things with your group and talk about any next steps you might be able to take to begin living this way.
3. As we launch Multiply, share with your group some of your initial thoughts about what you've heard. What most excites you about where God is leading Southbrook? What most challenges you as you think about the future of our church? Finally, share with your group any specific promptings you've felt thus far from the Holy Spirit as it relates to the part you might play in this initiative.

## PRAYER

- Write down how you've seen God be faithful to you personally, as well as towards Southbrook. Then, take a few minutes to praise God for His goodness.
- Ask God to show you what your next step needs to be in your journey as a disciple of Jesus. Be prayerful about when and how to take this next step.
- Begin praying for God to move and work in your life as we kick-off Multiply. Ask Him to give you a receptive heart to hear what He's speaking to you.

## STUDY QUESTIONS

1. What comes to mind when you think about church planting? Be specific. Discuss potential challenges for a church committed to planting other churches. Also, share some of the advantages to starting a new, worshipping community.
2. Read Acts 1:6-8. Why is it imperative for the Holy Spirit to come before the disciples go with the gospel? Explain. Also, talk about the importance of Jesus naming specific places He wanted the disciples to be His witnesses. How do His words apply to us today? Finally, compare Acts 1:8 to Acts 8:1. Consider and discuss how the “great persecution” (8:1) helped early believers fulfill Jesus’ command (1:8).
3. Read Acts 2:41-47. Observe how new disciples were quickly integrated into new, worshipping communities (i.e. church). Also, consider the kind of community these early believers experienced (2:42-47). What might this teach us about the need to plant new, smaller churches close to those you are trying to reach with the gospel? Explain.



## PRAYER

- Sit quietly before the Lord and consider the role He might have you play in our planting of churches. Pray simply: “Speak, for Your servant hears.” (1 Samuel 3:10)
- Ask the Lord to raise up the right leader(s) to lead our first church plant. Also, ask Him to begin stirring the hearts of those who will be sent.

## STUDY QUESTIONS

1. For most of us, talking about money is uncomfortable. However, Jesus talked about money and possessions a lot more than other topics. Discuss why you think Jesus spent so much time on this topic. What does this teach us about money and possessions? Also, what does it say about us as human beings? Explain.
2. Read Acts 4:32-37. This is an amazing picture of a vibrant, generous community of believers. What most stands out to you when you read about how they related to one another? Be specific. (See Acts 2:42-47 as a further comparison). How does this church's generosity challenge your understanding of what it means to be generous? Explain.
3. As you prayerfully consider your part in Multiply, think about how God might want to grow you in your generosity? Share as much as you're comfortable sharing with your group. In this week's sermon, we were challenged to reflect on what it might take for us to become a Generous Worshipping Community (see page 27). Which of these do you feel needs your attention? Share with your group. Then, commit to pray for one another as you continue to seek how God might be leading you.

## PRAYER

- Meditate on 1 Timothy 6:17-19. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal whether your hope is in God or the money He's given you. If necessary, confess your misplaced hope and ask God for the grace to fix your hope on Him alone.
- Reflect on God's generosity towards you (see John 3:16-17). Spend some time giving thanks to God for loving you so much that He'd send His own Son for you.
- Pray this prayer: God, in response to your generosity towards me, I want to become more generous myself. Therefore, show me how you want to grow me in my financial generosity. What would you have me commit to give towards Multiply?

## STUDY QUESTIONS

1. Read Ephesians 4:1-16. Which aspects of the picture Paul paints in these verses encourage you most when you think about Southbrook, generally, and your own discipleship, specifically? What do you find challenging or convicting and why? What excites you about being part of an equipping church?
2. Have you typically taken a more active or passive approach to equipping? Why do you think that is? What does the level of emphasis you place on equipping (yourself and others) say about how important you believe it to be? What changes might you need to make in light of Paul's words in this passage?
3. Read 1 Corinthians 12:1-31. What are your spiritual gifts (whether or not they are specifically mentioned in this passage) and how are you currently using them "for the common good"? In what ways could you more effectively use them? What would be the impact of us truly living out Ephesians 4:15-16?



## PRAYER

- Reflect on the hallmarks of a church that will multiply its gospel influence. Pray that they will become increasingly evident at Southbrook, and for God to reveal how you, personally, can grow in these things.
- Thank God for specific people who have played a role in equipping you as a disciple. Ask Him how you can play an equipping role in the lives of others and commit to acting on what He shows you.
- Pray for our outgoing residents—that God would guide them and use them powerfully as they continue to live out His call upon their lives. Pray for our incoming residents—that God would lead us to the right people and help us be effective in equipping them.

## STUDY QUESTIONS

1. It is not uncommon for churchgoers to find a church, grow comfortable, and never want to leave. Why do you think this is the mindset of many today? Explain. What are some of the advantages, as well as disadvantages to doing this? Be specific. Also, talk about how God's mission to reach the world with the gospel might be crippled by such a practice.
2. The Bible is clear that God has called us to be on the move with the gospel. Spend a few minutes reflecting on Matthew 9:35-38. Discuss how Jesus' words here speak to the urgency of sending people into the world. Think about your own heart towards those who have yet to hear the gospel. How do Jesus' words (and call to prayer) challenge you, personally?
3. As we continue to focus our efforts on being a sending church, how might God be leading you to participate? Maybe He's leading you to be more intentional where you live, learn, work, or play. Maybe He's calling you out of the marketplace and into full-time vocational ministry. For some, God might be calling you to a foreign mission field, or to be part of a local church plant. If you're already sensing God's prompting, share specifics with your group. If not, begin praying now for God to begin stirring your heart.

## PRAYER

- Pray for God to stir your heart for those who have yet to come to Jesus. Think about specific people you know. Pray for them by name, asking God to give you a greater desire to share the gospel with them.
- Offer up this simple prayer: God, are you calling me to be sent somewhere new for the sake of the gospel? Sit quietly as you seek to hear from the Lord.
- In obedience to Matthew 9:37-38, pray for God to start a sending movement at Southbrook where everyone is participating in the mission of the church. Pray for God to raise up more and more people to be sent out with the gospel.

# GENEROSITY GUIDE



## **WE MAKE FINANCIAL DECISIONS NEARLY EVERY DAY.**

Some are small—should you get a cup of coffee at McDonald’s or splurge for the fancy latte at Starbucks? Some are big—which house, which car, which college? Some concern the future—how much should you spend on Christmas, which retirement funds should you choose?

Probably the most challenging decision we make with money is the decision to give. Giving creates tension. We wonder, “If I give this away, how will the gap be filled?”

That’s why giving is such a big deal. Giving is one tangible way in which we declare our trust in and commitment to God. Giving often paves the way for God to show up in our lives in a powerful way.

We’ve put this generosity guide together to help you consider how God has blessed you and how He might invite you to trust Him during Southbrook’s Multiply Initiative.

## **HERE ARE SOME WAYS TO GIVE THAT PERHAPS YOU HAVEN'T THOUGHT ABOUT BEFORE.**



### **PRIORITY BUDGETING**

You may choose to rearrange your priorities and give up something in your current budget in order to give more to Multiply. Priority budgeting may mean postponing a planned expenditure such as a new car, vacation, remodeling, or other major purchases.



### **REDIRECT PRESENT EXPENDITURES**

Often, families have significant short-term expenditures for specific needs. Cash flow can be freed up when a loan is paid, tuition is no longer needed when a child graduates, etc. If a present expenditure will cease during the two-year initiative, would you consider using it toward your commitment?



### **INCREASES IN INCOME**

You may receive periodic increases in salary or bonuses from your employer. The temptation is to automatically modify your lifestyle to fit the higher income. But could God be calling you to something else?





## PERSONAL PROPERTY

Art, jewelry, coin collections, and other valuable assets can be sold.



## APPRECIATED ASSETS

Many people own assets that have achieved tremendous unrealized gains in value over the years. That is good news. The bad news is that if these assets were sold, some portion of the gain could be lost to taxation. Gifts of appreciated assets—typically investment securities and the like—can be advantageous to both the donor and the church. Unlike gifts of cash that have already incurred income tax, gifts of appreciated assets typically avoid the incurrence of capital gains tax. In addition, the donor is typically able to deduct for the full market value of the asset. Interested in learning more about asset-based giving? # WHAT WILL IT TAKE?

What will it take for us to reach our Multiply goal of \$8 million over two years? It's going to take commitments of all sizes. We can move closer to our goal by each of us making small changes in our lifestyles to sacrifice something that has value for something we value more—in this case, to multiply our gospel influence.

**Here are just a few examples of how a small change could become very large if we all participate:**

## GIVING IDEAS

### SMALL CHANGES, BIG RESULTS

#### **1 TV/Music Subscription \$144,000**
