REACH | MULTIPLICATION (PART 2)

Mark 1:16–20 / Luke 5:1–11

Refresh your memory by reading: Mark 1:16–20 / Luke 5:1–11

1. What stands out to you most about Jesus' call: "Follow me... I will make you fishers of men"? Why do you think the disciples responded so quickly to Jesus' call?
2. The sermon defined a disciple as someone who *follows Jesus, is changed by Jesus, and influences others*. Which of these is strongest in your life? Which is weakest?
3. In Luke 5, Peter responds to the miracle with humility and confession. Why is that an important starting point for following Jesus? When have you experienced a moment where God's power or provision became undeniable to you? How did you respond?
4. Which of these three areas do you naturally lean toward: following, being changed, or influencing others? Which do you tend to neglect? Who is someone you are currently influencing toward Jesus? If no one, what might be holding you back?
5. The message emphasized multiplication (disciples, leaders, churches). Why is multiplication essential to fulfilling the mission Jesus gave? What's the difference between just *learning about Jesus* and actually *multiplying disciples*?
6. Are you currently being discipled, discipling someone else, or both? What's your next step? What fears or obstacles keep people from discipling others?
7. Peter failed Jesus but was later restored and used by Him. How does that encourage you in your own walk? Is there an area of failure or regret that has held you back from being used by God?
8. The vision is that every man, woman, and child would hear and have an opportunity to respond to the gospel. What would it look like to live that out in your daily life (home, work, neighborhood)? What is one practical step you can take this week to follow Jesus more closely or help someone else follow Him?
