This guide is designed to help you reflect on and apply what you learned from the sermon this weekend. Use this guide as a quiet time this week. Write your answers in a journal, with the date and main passage noted at the top of the page.

- What main point from the sermon stood out to you? What did the Holy Spirit convict you of or encourage you with?
- What are some of the first things that come to mind when you hear the word. "freedom"? How do you respond when your freedom is abused?
- **Read Exodus 1:1-10.** Do you think fear is a common motivator for those who oppress others? Why or why not?
- How would you have responded if you were one of the oppressed Hebrews?
- **Read Genesis 15:12-14 and Exodus 1:11-14.** What do these passages reveal about God? What do they reveal about the nature of fear from oppressors?
- How does the resiliency of God's people in the face of persecution shape how you view God's presence?
- What is a situation in your everyday routine where you have to decide whether to fear God or man more?
- **Read Exodus 1:15-22.** What is honorable about the midwives? What is confusing in their story?
- What are some modern examples of laws of man that violate laws of God?
- How would you respond if you were asked to do something that violated your conscience or God's law?
- Would you be willing to suffer consequences from man to obey God? Explain.
- What does our passage today teach about suffering?
- How do you handle seasons of difficulty when God's moving may be imperceptible to you? What are some ways we can prepare now to face challenges when they arrive?
- Based on this passage or the sermon, what is one step of obedience the Holy Spirit is leading you towards this week?
