

PERSONAL REFLECTION GUIDE

7/19/26

At Southland Church, we are committed to help you KNOW Christ, LIVE like Him, and make Him KNOWN. This guide is designed to help you reflect on and apply what you learned from the sermon this weekend. Use this guide as a quiet time this week. Write your answers in a journal, with the date and main passage noted at the top of the page.

- What main point from the sermon stood out to you? What did the Holy Spirit convict you of or encourage you with?
- Imagine what it would feel like if your newborn baby was targeted to be killed by the government. What would you do? What steps would you take?
- **Read Exodus 2:1-4.** Why might the baby's beautiful appearance have been a deeper threat to his safety?
- As the baby approached 3 months old, why do you think it got more difficult to hide him?
- How do you think the mother felt when she was forced to leave him by the Nile? According to the text, who watched the baby from a distance?
- Has there been a time in your life when God has called you to give up something that you cared deeply about? How difficult was it to trust God in that moment?
- **Read Exodus 2:5-10.** What evidence of divine orchestration do you see in the circumstances around Moses' birth and adoption? How does it impact you knowing God is just as mindful of you as He was for Moses?
- What assurances about the future did Moses' mother have as she acted in faith?
- What do we learn about God and His work in the lives of His children through the story of Moses' deliverance?
- In this account, we see God take a seemingly impossible situation and provide an ideal opportunity. Have you ever seen God work in a similar way for you? How?
- How do you handle seasons of adversity when God's moving may be imperceptible to you? What are some ways we can prepare now to face those challenges when they arrive?
- What small act of faith might God be asking you to take this week?
- Based on this passage or the sermon, what is one step of obedience the Holy Spirit is leading you towards this week?
