## Why Study Judges? INTRODUCTION TO 'CULTURAL DETOX'

It's not difficult to look out at the world and say, "This place is toxic!" – rampant moral decay, abandonment of truth, and an increasing extremism, ego, and division. What can be more difficult, however, is to admit where the toxins have seeped into us – into our values, our beliefs, and our actions.


Israel too faced this problem. Faced it and failed. God had rescued His people from captivity, given them His law, His presence, and the "promised land" – but upon entering, Israel, who was supposed to be a "kingdom of priests and a holy nation," was far more influenced than influencer. They allowed the toxic culture seep into and become their own culture. The Book of Judges takes us through the downward spiral of a nation and its leaders as they abandon God and pursue the wickedness of the world around them. It's a dark book, but the darkness only serves to contrast the character and nature of our great God. Time and time again, Judges shows that Israel is a sin-sick society in need of a Savior.

Judges today is a wake-up call to the church, to us, of what happens when we cozy up to the world and let its values infiltrate our own. It's a calling to escape the toxic culture and embrace God's radical grace to save and to lead us into new paths. It's a true tale of the deadly impact of sin and the faithful God who still rescues. It invites us to unplug from the devices, apps and newsfeeds that fuel our departure from God's ways and plug ourselves back into Him. This sermons series is the admission that we need a *cultural detox*. We need to start replacing the "likes" of the world with God's own heart – His values, His loves, His word, Himself. This series calls on each of us to look inside, turn back to God, and find continuing deliverance and guidance in the Savior Jesus.

### **Getting the Most Out of this Study**

### RHYTHMS OF FAITH

We believe growth happens as you are involved in certain rhythms of the faith. If you have been through **ROOTED**, then you will be familiar with these and this will serve to help continue in those practices; if you have not been through **ROOTED**, you will greatly benefit, but please, consider joining a **ROOTED** group!

#### DAILY DEVOTIONS

We believe God wants to meet with you as you read His Word. There are 5 days of scripture reading for each week with a curated mix from Judges, Deuteronomy, and the New Testament. These readings and the insights you glean from them will form the foundation of your group discussions. You should be able to complete the reading and **SOMA** method in under 30 minutes a day.

#### **GROUP TIME**

We believe God wants you to journey with others. These weekly gatherings will be a place of encouraging one another by sharing what God is teaching you in your devotional time, as well as a source for prayer and service.

### **PRAYER**

We believe that God works through prayer. Prayer will be an important component of your daily reading and your group time. Additionally we are hoping each group will set aside a two hour special gathering to do a focused Prayer experience.

### **SERVE THE COMMUNITY**

We believe that our love for Jesus will spill out into the community. Our hope is that each group will find a way to serve the community in a relational way. You can start brainstorming with your group from the beginning of a way to make an impact with a real need in the name of Jesus.

#### SHARE YOUR STORY

We believe that God is continually in the business of life transformation. He has worked in your life and He wants to work through you to transform others. As we share our stories (testimony or other instances of God's work in your life) with our group, we'll also be prayerfully looking for opportunities to share our story and God's story (the gospel) with others.

### **WEEKLY SERMONS**

We believe God has gifted us for the building up of the church body. Join us Sunday mornings in-person or online to deepen your understanding and application of the Book of Judges.




**SOMA\*** is an easy-to-use Bible study method for jumping into a passage and mining its riches. This method can be repeated with any passage of the Bible and used for personal Bible reading, one-on-one bible study, and small group bible study. Our hope and prayer is that our church body could learn this method over time and have confidence in reading the Bible on their own, as well as with others.

\*Fun fact: 'Soma' is the Greek word for 'body,' which is really what this is all about: building up the body of Christ, the church.

**Soak:** Read the passage slowly asking the Holy Spirit to open it to you. We want to soak in it, marinate, steep in it, asking the Spirit to guide us into the scriptures and notice its surroundings.

We want to ask questions about the context of the passage in these areas:

- Genre: What kind of writing is this? Narrative? Poem? Letter?
- Circumstances: Who is writing this? To whom? Are there any clues as to why? Maybe the Israelites are worshipping idols again. Maybe Paul is in prison again. Maybe the Corinthians messed up again.
- Connection to the rest of the story: Where does this passage fit in to the rest of the book? What has happened so far?



We want to ask observation questions of the text:

- What are the key words? Are there any words or ideas that are repeated?
- What do you learn about the main characters? How are they described by the author?
- Is time or place significant in this passage?
- Is there a conflict?
- Are there any surprises?
- Do you have any questions from the passage? Is there anything difficult to understand or something you'd like to ask the author?

**Meaning:** Now that we've gotten familiar with the passage, knowing what is there, we want to get at its meaning. The meaning of the passage doesn't come from us, but from the author. Instead of asking questions like: "What does this passage mean to me?", we want to ask questions like: "What is the author trying to say?"

Here are some questions to help arrive at the meaning:

- What is the main point of the passage? What is the author really trying to get across?
- How could you sum up the meaning of this passage in your own words?
- What does this passage reveal about who Jesus is, and what he came into the world to do?
- How does the coming and work of Jesus on the cross change how we understand this passage?

For reading Judges, the main point usually boils down to these 2 questions:

- What's wrong with this picture?
- Where's God in this story?



**A** | **Apply:** After trying to wrap our heads around the meaning of the passage, we want to seek to apply it to our lives. The goal of reading the Bible is transformation. We want to let the Word of God grow deep in us so that we can bear much fruit.

A helpful way to think about application is to ask questions about how it transforms our head (knowledge and beliefs), our heart (desires and attitudes), and our hands (actions and practices).

- Head: How does this passage challenge or confirm your beliefs?
- Heart: How does this passage challenge your desires and attitudes? Is there something you need to change?
- Hands: What does this passage tell us to go and do with our energy, time, and resources?
- Is there any response to this passage you feel that the Spirit is impressing upon vou?

**PRAYER:** Finish your time in God's Word by using this passage as the subject of your prayer. Take time to thank God for what was learned and express your desire for His continued work of transformation in your life.

### **Prayer Experience**

### **GROUP PRAYER TIME (30 min)**

All things begin first with God... His glory, majesty, and power. We want to begin our time by simply looking to Him and acknowledging His worth above all things. In looking up we set out to focus our hearts together on Him.

Read the following scriptures as a group, taking time after each one to silently reflect, and then respond in group prayer praising God for how He's revealed in His word.

### **INDIVIDUAL PRAYER TIME (60 min)**

In prayer we are led by the Holy Spirit to look deeper in. Deeper into the truth of His Word and deeper into our own hearts as He reveals to us those areas that we have attempted to hide away from His view and the view of others. Take time to allow him to speak by His Word and by his Spirit as you journey deeper in.

### Divine Reading (Lectio Divina)

- 1. **Read**: Don't dive into the temptation to simply glance over these passages, some of which may be very familiar to you. Take time to read them and in turn allow them to read you. You may find it helpful to read each passage a few times pausing each time before reading and asking God to speak the truth of each word to your heart.
- 2. **Reflect**: After reading allow time and space to reflect or ponder in your heart what you have just read. Allow God's Word to become His Word to you and illuminate the deep truth of the text by the Holy Spirit.
- 3. **Pray**: After you've read and reflected on the passage move on to prayer. Through your spoken and written word and dedicate the truth of His Word to Him in your heart.
- 4. **Contemplate**: Then contemplate on the truth of what has been revealed through His Word. God speaks... take time, listen, wait, and rest in the reality of His presence and the fullness of His love.



### GROUP DEBRIEF (30 min)

Take time to debrief the experience and discuss how each person was able to meet with God and engage His voice through prayer and scripture. Finish by thanking God in prayer for what He has done here today.

### **Serve Experience**

Somewhere between weeks 6 and 8, we want your group to serve in your community. The goal is to show the love of Christ through relational service outside of a Sunday worship gathering. We believe that our love for Jesus will spill out into the community through intentional Christ-like acts. Consider these points as you serve (adapted from **ROOTED**):

#### LIFE-CHANGE

Serving is not something we do to check off a box, but rather a lifestyle to adopt. Our hope is that you will want to continue finding ways to serve in our community.

#### **BEING VS. DOING**

Each serving opportunity is intended to be highly relational. It's not just about a service or product to provide, but a chance to interact with another person who also needs the love and grace of God. You will find that you are not so different than those you help, and their primary need is the same need you have: peace with God

#### DEBRIEF

Gather as a group at the end of your time of serving to pray, and to debrief you experience. What is God speaking to you about your life? About serving? About possible next steps? Share with your group.

#### **FLEXIBILITY**

Serving can get messy and unexpected things will happen. Please be flexible and remember we are there to serve, so be ready and willing to do whatever is asked of us that day. It's all part of the adventure!
