

Is It Important To Read The Bible?

""This book will keep you from sin, or sin will keep you from this book." That was true then, and it's still true today. Dusty Bibles always led to dirty lives. In fact, you are either in the Word and the Word is conforming you to the image of Jesus Christ, or you are in the world and the world is squeezing you into its mold."



How Much Do We Read The Bible

- 47% of Americans claimed to read the Bible (2006 study)
 - That means at some point once a week
 - This is up from 31% in 1995
 - Barna Group Poll
- 82% of Americans claimed the Bible to be the literal or "inspired" Word of God
 - But 50% of these people can not name one of the four gospels

- Relevance: It does not have anything to say in this modern world
- Technique: I don't know how to read it. It's all so confusing
- *Professionals:* It's meant for professionals like pastors and educated people



- Time: I don't have time, I'm to busy
- Reliability: There are some unbelievable things in it. How can an intelligent, educated person believe it?
- Boring: It is dry, uninteresting, and hard, I fall asleep when I read it



- Relevance: We will see in this study that the Bible is as relevant today as it was when it was written
- Technique: This study will give you the skills to read not only your Bible but almost any piece of literature
- Professionals: If you can read you can study the Bible
 - And don't be put off by the word study
 - This is not English 101, no written tests will be given



- *Time*: This a valid reason, you have a lot of priorities in your life
 - You must determine what and where reading Gods
 Word lies in your priorities
- *Reliability*: By the end of this class, you will see the consistency of the Bible
- Boring: Things are boring when you don't understand
 - By the end you will be excited to read the Bible

Why Should I Read the Bible?

- Why should I study the Bible?
 - What are the benefits?
 - What difference will it make in my life?
 - What do I get out of it?



Why Should I Read the Bible?

- There are three main reason
 - Bible study is essential to Spiritual Growth
 - Bible study is essential to Spiritual Maturity
 - Bible study is essential to **Spiritual Effectiveness**



Spiritual Growth

- 1 Peter 2:2
 - Like newborn babes, long for the pure milk of the word, that by it you may grow in respect to salvation.
- Three truths are found here
 - Attitude
 - Appetite
 - Aim



Attitude

- We are to have the attitude of a new born baby
 - Babies cry for milk
 - Babies need milk to physically live
- We need the scriptures to live spiritually
 - We need to cry for Gods Word when we are without it



Appetite

- We need to crave the word as a baby craves milk
 - We need to long for the Word
- But not everyone likes the taste some think it is like
 - Nasty Medicine: It is good for me but yech
 - Shredded Wheat: It is nourishing but dry and tasteless
 - Strawberries and Cream: You can't stop eating it
- Which one are you?



Aim

- What is the aim of the Bible?
 - "That by it you may grow"
 - Not only know but grow
- The Bible was written to help you see how you can grow into Christs image
 - Not just know the rules of right and wrong



Are You Growing Old or Up

- Are you growing old right now?
 - Have you stopped growing up and are just getting old?
- Or are you still growing up?
 - The Bible is here to help you grow
 - And this should not stop till you are dead



- Hebrews 5:11-14
 - Concerning [Christ] we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need milk and not solid food. For everyone who partakes only of milk is not accustomed to the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. But solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil.

- This is an instructive passage
- The writer says
 - "We have a lot to say" but
 - "It's hard to explain"
- Why?
 - Is it because the material is hard?
 - No



- It is because the people are slow
 - "By this time" you should be the teacher
- You are still taking the same class over and over
 - You should be eating steak not milk





- What makes you Spiritually Mature?
 - When you have a doctorate in theology?
 - When you know the most Bible verses?
 - No
- The mark of spiritual maturity is not how much you understand, but how much you use.
- In the spiritual realm, the opposite of ignorance is not knowledge but obedience.

Spiritual Effectiveness

- 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.



Spiritual Effectiveness

- Paul says scripture is "profitable" for four specific things
 - Doctrine/Teaching
 - It structures your thinking
 - What you believe determines how you behave
 - Rebuke
 - It tells you what sin is
 - How God wants you to live



Spiritual Effectiveness

- Correction
 - It shows you where you are messing up
- Training in Righteous Living
 - It shows you the correct way to live

Chapter 4



Methodicalness

- There is a method to follow
 - This means a precise set of steps, in order
- The Method is (In order):
- 1. Observation: What do I see? Be a detective
- 2. Interpretation: What does it mean?
- 3. Application: How does it work? Not, Does it work?



Observation (What Do I See)

- Terms
 - These are key words, typically, words used over and over in a book or passage
- Structure
 - Grammatical structure (Subject, Verb, Object)
 - Literary structure (Question/Answer, Climax/Resolution, Cause/Effect)



Observation (What Do I See)

- Literary Form
 - Genre (Poetry, Narrative, Parables)
- Atmosphere
 - Place yourself in the setting described
 - Use your imagination to join what is going on



Interpretation (What Does It Mean)

- Questions
 - Ask the Bible questions, it doesn't mind
- Answers
 - Look for answers to your questions
- Integration
 - Put all the answers together



Application (How Does It Work)

- How does it work for me
 - Look to how the scriptures speak to your life first
 - If it doesn't work in your life, what credibility do you have to speak it into other lives
- How does it work for others
 - Last is how the scriptures speak into others lives
 - Their marriage, work, school life, etc...



Observation: What do I see? Interpretation: What does it mean? Application: How does it work?
