As the communion servers pass in front of you, please remember to take **both** of the stacked cups from the tray. Note that the bread is in the bottom cup and is gluten-free. Grape juice in the colored cups in the inner ring, wine in the clear cups in the outer rings.

JULIAN ZUGG MIAMI INTERNATIONAL SEMINARY (MINTS)







MINTS trains pastors, Christian workers, and future leaders to reach their own people with the gospel. Working closely with Reformed denominations they create and translate Reformed materials into other languages. They work closely with the Reformed Presbyterian church in many African countries including Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Malawi, Mozambique, Sierra Leone as well as in the Ukraine, a large Asian country, and in the US prisons. **Julian Zugg** is the *Provost* and *International English Director of* MINTS. As Provost he is focusing on the organizational side for the next few months while travel is restricted. He looks forward to being able to travel again and teach, write, and develop materials, as he provides support to MINTS centers in other countries.

Brooks was born in Texas and grew up in Nashville, TN. He attended the University of Tennessee in Knoxville and later got a pastoral degree from Covenant Theological Seminary (CTS) in St. Louis, MO. He and his wife Meredith met at RUF at the University of Tennessee and after graduation were married and moved to Nashville where Meredith served as an RUF intern at Vanderbilt University. After completing his degree at CTS, Brooks became the RUF Campus Minister at the University of Houston (UH). UH is the sixth most ethnically diverse university in the nation with students from many nationalities and religious traditions



August 16 - Paul Miller, Texas Regional Director, Metanoia Prison Ministry, PCA Mission to North America

Upon graduating from Westminster Theological Seminary, Paul and Laura Miller launched RUF at Texas A&M Corpus Christi (TAMUCC) in 2008. Paul served seven years as campus minister at TAMUCC. He has served as an assistant and associate pastor in the PCA, as a hospital chaplain at Methodist Hospital in Dallas, and now as the Texas regional director of Metanoia Prison Ministries (Metanoia is the official prison ministry of the PCA).
