ABOUT THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized, belong to a church which embraces the Gospel, and who look in faith to the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. Since Communion is a sacrament of sustaining grace, we request that children not participate until they have professed their faith to the elders of this church or their church of regular worship.

As the communion servers pass in front of you, please remember to take **both** of the stacked cups from the tray. Note that the bread is in the bottom cup and is gluten-free. Grape juice is in the colored cups in the outer ring, wine is in the clear cups in the inner rings.

In 1998 the Southwest Church Planting Network (SWCPN) was formed to make expanding the Kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ a high priority in the Southwest region (covering the states of Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas). By the grace of God SWCPN surpassed its original goal to plant 50 new churches and initiate 10 Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) chapters by planting 100 churches and initiating 26 RUF chapters.

Today SWCPN comprises 75 churches representing over 28,000 members coming together to fulfill a bold, Gospel vision. Consequently, SWCPN is strategically positioned in terms of visionary leadership, opportunity and resources to plan for the future and become an even greater vehicle for Kingdom expansion in our region.

The three major objectives of SWCPN are 1) identifying and training leaders; 2) planting churches and new RUF chapters; 3) nurturing new plants to full maturity.

Prayer Needs

- Pray for the pastors of church plants that they would boldly preach the Gospel and wisely minister to their growing flocks.
- Pray for RUF campus ministers as they mentor student leaders, plan outreach to students on campus, and share the gospel one-on-one, online, and in small group settings.
