# MISSIONARY OF THE WEEK August 9, 2020

## BROOKS & MEREDITH HARWOOD & SOPHIE

Reformed University Fellowship University of Houston



Brooks was born in Texas and grew up in Nashville, TN. He attended the University of Tennessee in Knoxville and later got a pastoral degree from Covenant Theological Seminary (CTS) in St. Louis, MO. He and his wife Meredith met in RUF at the University of Tennessee and after graduation they married and moved to Nashville where Meredith served as an RUF intern at Vanderbilt University. After completing his degree at CTS, Brooks became the RUF Campus Minister at the University of Houston (UH).

Brooks has a heart for speaking and demonstrating the gospel to those of diverse religious backgrounds, the unchurched, and those who have moved away from the faith in which they were raised. The University of Houston is the sixth most ethnically diverse university in the nation, with students from many nationalities and religious traditions.

#### Prayer:

- Wisdom for Fall-Planning. We need the Spirit to lead us as much as possible in this strange and new time.
- Friendships in our Group. Our students need now, more than ever, to be knitted together
  in love for one another. But we need to provide creative avenues for those friendships to form,
  maintain, and grow.
- Courage to Try and Fail. We need the freedom and a deeper trust in Jesus to try little things and be okay with it not going the way we want.
- **Wisdom for Hospitality.** Meredith and I, in particular, need wisdom on how, when, and who we will invite into our home in the coming months.
- New Students. We are praying that God would raise up new students in this group. Particularly we are praying that God will send 30 new students this fall.
- New Leaders. We need God to raise up new leaders who are willing to safely lead regional small
  groups that will be decentralized throughout the city to provide outdoor gathering space for students
  for prayer, discussion, and relationship.

August 2 - Julian Zugg, International English Director, MINTS

Julian Zugg was born in England and raised in South Africa. In 1986, he moved back to England, where he read Law, qualified as a Barrister (US trial lawyer), and taught Law at Buckingham University for eight years. In 2001, he graduated from Reformed Theological Seminary (MDiv. Jackson) and worked as an assistant/associate minster involved in all areas of pastoral ministry in the PCA from 2002-2008. In 2008, he was called as the Director of Theology at Belize Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Belize. He is currently the Provost and International English Director for MINTS (Miami International Seminary), where his

duties include teaching, writing, developing, and supporting MINTS centers in eleven countries.

Upon graduating from Westminster Theological Seminary, Paul and Laura Miller launched RUF at Texas A&M Corpus Christi (TAMUCC) in 2008. Paul served seven years as campus minister at TAMUCC. He has served as an assistant and associate pastor in the PCA; as a hospital chaplain at Methodist Hospital in Dallas; and now as the Texas regional director of Metanoia Prison Ministries (Metanoia is the official prison ministry of the PCA).
