The selection of men to serve in the office of Deacon is the duty and privilege of the members of the congregation of Spring Cypress Presbyterian Church (SCPC). Please keep the following considerations in mind:

- 1. **Only** *communing members* of SCPC are *eligible to submit* nominations.
- 2. **Only** *men who are communing members* of SCPC are *eligible to be nominated*.
- 3. **Only** *signed* nominations *received on this form* will be considered valid.
- 4. Please submit your nomination form by placing it in the Nomination basket in the Narthex.
- 5. <u>Nomination does not guarantee election as a Deacon!</u> After the nomination period closes, the Session will thoroughly vet nominees. Only those nominees who successfully complete this rigorous process, and are approved by the Session, will appear on the ballot for the January 2022 congregational meeting.
- 6. The man or men you nominate for the office of Deacon <u>must</u> meet the qualifications expressed in **1 Timothy 3:1-13** (with the exception of the requirement of being able to teach) and **Titus 1:5-16** (see the back of this form).
- 7. All nominations must be received by March 28, 2021.

Oualifications of Church Officers

1. Overarching Qualification: He must be "above reproach" or "blameless." (1 Tim 3:2, Titus 1:6)

- Does not mean sinless or flawless.
- Does mean he is characterized by a spiritually mature and morally upright character resulting in a godly lifestyle.

2. Family Qualifications (Family and Home)

- The husband of one wife: faithful and devoted to his wife, a "one-woman" man. (1 Tim 3:2, Titus 1:6)
- Rule or manages his household well. (1 Tim 3:4)
- Children are obedient and show proper respect. (1 Tim 3:4, Titus 1:6)
- Spiritual leader in his own home. (1 Tim 3:5)

3. Stewardship Qualifications (Finances)

- Free from the love of money (1 Tim 3:3), Not greedy for gain (Titus 1:7)
- Manages his money well as a steward (Titus 1:7)

4. Social Qualifications (Relationships with others)

- Respectable (1 Tim 3:2), Hospitable (1 Tim 3:2, Titus 1:8)
- Not quarrelsome (1 Tim 3:3, Titus 1:7)
- Good reputation outside the church (1 Tim 3:7)
- Not a gossip (1 Tim 3:11)

5. Self-Control Qualifications

- Sober-minded (1 Tim 3:2, 11)
- Not a drunkard (1 Tim 3:3, Titus 1:7)
- Self-controlled (Titus 1:8)
- Not quick-tempered (Titus 1:7), Not arrogant (Titus 1:7)

6. Reflection of Inner-Character Qualifications

- Prudent (1 Tim 3:2), Sensible (Titus 1:7)
- Gentle (1 Tim 3:3), Dignified (1 Tim 3:8, 11), Not double-tongued (1 Tim 3:8)
- Lover of good, upright, disciplined (Titus 1:8)
- Holy (Titus 1:8)

7. Maturity/Experience Qualifications

- Not a recent convert (1 Tim 3:6)
- Tested and proven in service (1 Tim 3:10), Faithful in all his duties (1 Tim 3:11)
- A good example to all (1 Tim 4:12)

8. Doctrinal Qualifications
