ABOUT THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized, belong to a church which embraces the Gospel, and who look in faith to the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. Since Communion is a sacrament of sustaining grace, we request that children not participate until they have professed their faith to the elders of this church or their church of regular worship.

As the communion servers pass in front of you, please remember to take **both** of the stacked cups from the tray. Note that the bread is in the bottom cup and is gluten-free. Grape juice is in the colored cups in the outer ring, wine is in the clear cups in the inner rings.

DEREK & SHANNON EBBERS HANNAH Mission to the World. Romania



Derek and Shannon have been investing in lives and helping to build Christ's Church in Romania since 2007. Derek is the team leader and their team's vision is to establish Reformed and covenantal churches through identifying, training, and resourcing national church planters. Both Derek and Shannon serve their local church community in many ways. Last October they held a follow-up family conference that focused on communication and conflict resolution. It was a special time to share and learn about how the Gospel impacts family and all relationships. The Ebbers' 28-year journey with homeschooling is coming to an end as their youngest child Hannah completed her core subjects and is looking for internship opportunities and professional development classes. They have been asked to mentor a young homeschooling family from The Republic of Moldova and encourage a brand new homeschool group with a potential visit. Shannon is assisting a new Christian school start-up three days a week with their English and cognitive development. Derek and Shannon are fully invested in their community allowing God to use their experiences to glorify Him and edify others!
