ABOUT THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized, belong to a church which embraces the Gospel, and who look in faith to the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. Since Communion is a sacrament of sustaining grace, we request that children not participate until they have professed their faith to the elders of this church or their church of regular worship.

As the communion servers pass in front of you, please remember to take **both** of the stacked cups from the tray. Note that the bread is in the bottom cup and is gluten-free. Grape juice is in the colored cups in the outer ring, wine is in the clear cups in the inner rings.

MISSIONARY OF THE MONTH September 2023

RICK & BETTY ASCHMANN ANNE & NATHAN MISSION TO THE WORLD, QUITO, ECUADOR



Rick and Betty serve in Ecuador among the Quichua Indians. Their ministry focuses on Bible translation, leadership training, church planting, and literature production in the Quichua Indian language. Rick was ordained as a pastor in 2014, after a two-year church planting internship in Bogotá, Colombia. The Aschmanns then returned to Ecuador to begin a new church-planting work among the Quichua Indians. Rick is also involved in Bible translation projects in two Indigenous languages to provide God's Word in the heart language of the Ecuadorian people.

Prayer/Praise:

- Praise for the progress in translating the Old Testament in the Central Highland Quichua language. Pray for the work of Quichua translator, Daniel Sigla, for the editing team of which Rick is a part, and the Quichua community leaders as they start checking the translation.
- Pray for safety for the Aschmanns and their Christian friends in Ecuador. Crime is rampant and continuing to get worse.
- Pray for Anne and Nathan as they study at Concordia University in Seward, Nebraska.
 Anne is starting her third year, studying math education and Nathan is in his freshman year studying Physics.
- Pray for Rick and Betty's travels throughout the U.S. this 2023-24 school year as they visit partners in the ministry in about 10 different states.
