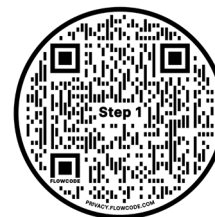

SERMON SERIES:
CHURCH ON FIRE, Chapter 5, Mentor Church Leaders

Title: *The Soldier, The Farmer and The Athlete*

Guest Preacher: The Rev. Joshua Youssef, President and CEO, *Help The Persecuted*

The apostle Paul uses three metaphors in this passage to communicate faithful service to His kingdom. By the power of Christ's supernatural grace, believers are serving and suffering as good soldiers, farmers, and athletes in areas hostile to the gospel.

Joshua Youssef serves as President and CEO of *Help The Persecuted*, headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia. With field teams situated throughout the Middle East, North Africa, and Asia *Help The Persecuted* is uniquely positioned to serve those facing severe persecution. Each year, Islamic extremism ranks as the dominant global driver of persecution, and over the past several years this region has faced some of the largest refugee crisis in history. *Help The Persecuted* serves those suffering for their faith in Christ with practical and spiritual support. Previously, Joshua served for seventeen years as Executive Vice President of *Leading The Way* with Dr. Michael Youssef, a global media ministry. Joshua earned his bachelor's degree in Communications from Auburn University. He is currently pursuing his M.A.R. at Reformed Theological Seminary in Atlanta, where he lives with his wife, two daughters and three sons.

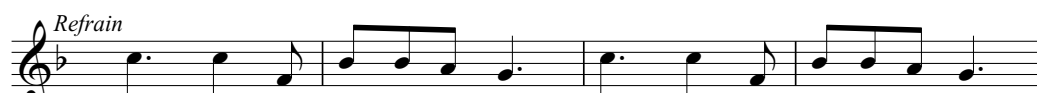

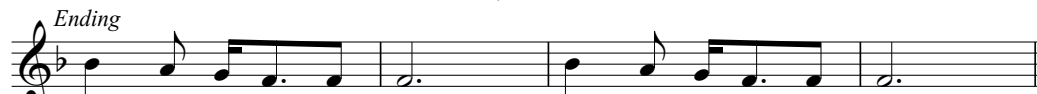

The Scriptures teach that much of our spiritual renewal comes from hearing the Word of God, which cleanses our minds and purifies our hearts.

In the **Confession of Sin** and **Absolution**, our sins, both individual and corporate are confessed, and we are reassured of God's complete forgiveness through Jesus Christ. We begin with a cleansing admission and confession of sin followed by an authoritative pronouncement of God's forgiveness in Christ Jesus, which allow us to move forward into the power of forgiveness.

About The Prayers: If God knows everything what's the point of prayer? Clearly prayer is not about "informing God" of anything. In short, prayer is a way of saying "yes, Lord, I want to develop a relationship with you, receive your life, share my life."

About the "*posture*" of prayer: It has been commonly said that Anglicans kneel for prayer, but that is not the rule for posture in any edition of the Prayer Book. Various editions have assumed that standing is the normal posture for public prayer and have directed the people to kneel only for confessions, for reciting the Commandments, etc. However, in this parish it is the traditional discipline to kneel for the prayers. It is a posture of humility, which is something always worth cultivating in us.

Amen.*

The Lord's Prayer: like the Creed this prayer given to us by our Lord is designed to "cover all the bases". It is the basic and essential structure of a complete prayer life.

The **Peace** is a particularly good time to welcome visitors and newcomers. Please take a moment to extend God's peace to those around you. That peace, which the world cannot give, comes only through the forgiving of Jesus Christ. This peace is not rooted in our circumstances but in the presence, promise, and power of God and Christ's redeeming work.
