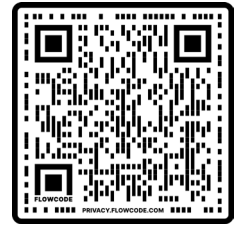

Name Tags Are Missional!

One of the ways we can all be mission minded is to wear name tags! Wearing name tags helps everyone, newcomers and those who have been around to feel more comfortable starting conversations and engaging relationships. So please, as you come in, write your name on a name tag....even if it's just for the sake of the other. It's one of the ways we love our neighbors as our ourselves (Matthew 22:39).

Today's Sermon

Title: *What Would You Ask For?*

Preacher: The Rev. Aaron Schnupp

If you could have anything in the world, what would you ask for? While this is a hypothetical, ice-breaker style question for most people, in our passage today, we will see that God asks King Solomon this question with the promise that he will fulfill Solomon's request. By looking at Solomon's answer, we will consider what our hearts truly desire and what God wants for his people.

Officiant Dearly beloved, the Scriptures teach us to acknowledge our many sins and offenses, not concealing them from our heavenly Father, but confessing them with humble and obedient hearts that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy. We ought at all times humbly to acknowledge our sins before Almighty God, but especially when we come together in his presence to give thanks for the great benefits we have received at his hands, to declare his most worthy praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things which are necessary for our life and our salvation. Therefore, kneeling, draw near with me to the throne of heavenly grace.

The liturgy begins with the
Acclamation, which is an
“eager expression” of praise.

In the **Confession of Sin** and **Absolution**, our sins, both individual and corporate are confessed, and we are reassured of God's complete forgiveness through Jesus Christ. We begin with a cleansing admission and confession of sin followed by an authoritative pronouncement of God's forgiveness in Christ Jesus, which allow us to move forward in the power of forgiveness.

And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may now live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of your holy Name. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed:

This is the basic and essential structure of the Christian faith. Every word is packed with meaning. Once the Gospel is given this is the response made by the community who have chosen to trust the truth of what God has revealed about Himself through His Son in the power of His Holy Spirit.

Catholic simply means universal, not specifically the Roman Catholic Church.

The Lord's Prayer: like the Creed this prayer given to us by our Lord is designed to "cover all the bases". It is the basic and essential structure of a complete prayer life.

About The Suffrages:

The word "suffrage" is another word for "petition" or "an asking." It comes from the Latin word from which we get the word "to vote." Each suffrage is based on different words from the Scriptures Pss 85, 20, 132, 28, 122, 51, respectively. Again, notice that the vast majority of everything we say from the Prayer Book is composed of phrases that are taken directly out of the Bible.

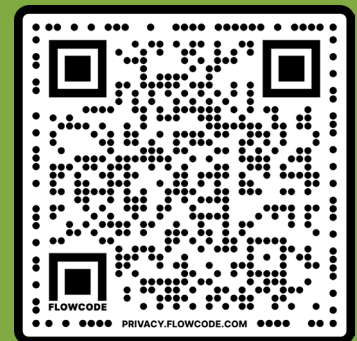

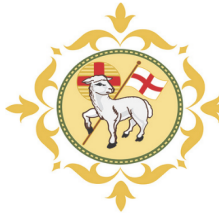
